Labor Day Statement of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops

“This Labor Day we draw our attention to our sisters and brothers who face trials in the area of their work and its effect on their family. The Church shares hope in the dignity of each human person and the sanctity of work, reaffirming our trust in a good and gracious God who knows what we need before we ask him.

“Millions of families still find themselves living in poverty, unable to find sufficient work. Poverty rates among children are alarmingly high. The family is bent under the weight of these economic pressures and related cultural forces especially the lack of access to adequate education. Financial concerns and breakdowns in family life can lead to a sense of hopelessness and despair often manifesting in drug and alcohol abuse.

“Our leaders must never use anxiety as a means to manipulate persons in desperate situations, or to pit one group against another for political gain. For our dynamics to change, we must replace fear with a fuller vision of the dignity of each human life that is supported by our faith. To counter hopelessness we need to fill others with a sense of their God-given dignity, and help them to know they are not alone in their struggles.

“Dignified work is at the heart of who we are as human beings. Our labor is an essential key to understanding our social relationships, vital to family, and the building up of community with God-given dignity. Poverty is often a result of the violation of human dignity, either because the opportunities for work are denied able workers, or because a low value is put on honest work and the rights that flow from it, especially the right to a just wage and to the personal security of the worker and his or her family.

“Solidarity recognizes that each of us is connected, and we all have the responsibility to care for one another, particularly those who are poor and vulnerable. The principle of subsidiarity recognizes that challenges should be addressed at the appropriate level of society with the capacity to do so, and in concert with others. Employers are called to respect the dignity of workers through a just wage and working conditions that allow for a secure family life. Workers in return owe employers competent and dedicated labor.

“With our neighbors and our communities we must advocate for jobs and wages that truly provide a dignified life for individuals and their families, and for working conditions that are safe and allow for a full flourishing of life outside of the workplace. Workers’ associations, while imperfect, remain an important part of that effort, and people of faith and goodwill can be powerful leaven to ensure that these groups continue to keep human dignity at the heart of their efforts.

“Every economic and political system must provide each person with the opportunity to live in dignity and freedom, able to support a family, educate children, praise God, and develop one's full human potential. We do not get dignity from power or money or fame. We get dignity from work. Without honest work, dignity is lost.”

Everyone is welcome to attend.

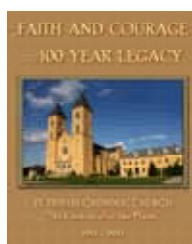


“Faith and Courage...100 Year Legacy”
