

And a voice came from heaven,

"You are my beloved Son;

with you I am well pleased."



Yogi Berra said famously, "It's déjà vu all over again." An old proverb says, "The more things change the more they are the same." The Sesame Street gang had its popular theme song, "Different yet the Same." These insights might be helpful for baptized Christians to understand today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord and how it relates to their own baptism.

If we limit the meaning of Baptism to our own baptism, we will never understand the Baptism of Christ. Why would the sinless Son of God receive baptism which frees one of sin and makes one a child of God? Even the Evangelists who recounted this event in the life of Christ appear uneasy with it, as their differing accounts indicate.

Mark (1:9-1) tells of the baptism straightforward without comment. Matthew (3:13-17) has John address the awkward situation, "I should be baptized by you." And he offers this explanation, "We must do this to fulfill all of God's demands." Other translations have "We must do this to fulfill all righteousness." In today's reading, Luke (3:21-22) shifts the focus to the Holy Spirit coming upon Jesus in prayer. "When Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heavens opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove."

But these three different accounts all conclude the baptism of Jesus with the voice of God the Father, "This is my beloved Son." That sameness in difference is at the heart of the meaning of the baptism of Christ: Jesus is the Son of God, sent by the Father on a mission of salvation. His baptism is the public proclamation that Jesus has been anointed by the Father as Messiah with the power, wisdom, and holiness for that role. The gospel of John does not recount the Baptism of the Lord but conveys the same message when John the Baptist tells his followers, "Look, there is the Lamb of God."

The simple fact that God the Father speaks at the baptism of Christ is very significant. Only three times in the gospels does God the Father speak: at the baptism of Christ, at his Transfiguration (Mt 17:1-13; Mk 9:2-13; Lk 9:28-36), and as Christ prepares for his passion (Jn 12:28). Each of these events offers a fundamental insight into the identity of Christ in relation to the Father and his mission from the Father.

Different, yet the same. The Baptism of Christ resembles a photographic negative, a template, a pattern, a mold, the DNA of our own baptism. His baptism reveals his holiness and his mission; our baptism gives us a share in his holiness and commissions us as his disciples.

The opening prayer of today's Mass sees that sameness in difference:

"Almighty ever-living God, who, when Christ had been baptized in the river Jordan, and as the Holy Spirit descended upon him, declared him your beloved Son, grant that we your children by adoption, reborn of water and the Holy Spirit, may always be well pleasing to you."
