The Other Good Samaritan

Two Samaritans are featured in the gospels and both of them were good. The one in the Parable of the Good Samaritan is better known but the Samaritan leper in today's gospel was also a man of virtue. He was grateful. We read this gospel on Thanksgiving Day as a challenge to imitate his humble thanks in contrast to the thoughtless nine.

The gospel stories of the Good and the Grateful Samaritan have a one-two punch. The second punch is the haymaker. Too often we focus only on the message that the Good Samaritan was kind to his neighbor and the Grateful Samaritan was thankful for being healed.

But the second punch in these gospels, the knockout punch, is that they were Samaritans. The subtle but significant message in today's gospel is that while a healthy Jew would never associate with a Samaritan, nine outcast Jewish lepers had welcomed a Samaritan leper into their group. Leprosy made them physically ill, but it cured them of their prejudice.

We all have Samaritans in our lives, people whom we deem inferior to ourselves. At times we profile or prejudice even our own family, our friends, and our neighbors: a careless child, a stubborn spouse, a nosy neighbor. And we take perverse comfort in their perceived failings as though that somehow made us more virtuous.

Realizing that the Samaritans in my life are as good as I am, perhaps in some areas better, is a difficult moment of truth. When that defense is stripped away, I must face my conscience with a new candor. The goodness of the Samaritans in my life challenge me to a more authentic self.



The Good Samaritan and the Grateful Samaritan do remind us to be kind to our neighbor and thankful for our blessings. But they also reveal that those whom we judge to be less virtuous are often, in some matters, more virtuous than we are. The Samaritans in our lives make us face our failings more honestly.

There are no atheists in fox holes, no bigots in cancer wards, and even a lone Samaritan leper was welcomed by nine Jewish lepers. In the Bible leprosy is often an image of sin and being cured of leprosy is analogous to being cleansed of sin. When those lepers faced their human sickness, they were freed of their sin of prejudice. If we confront our sinful prejudices we will also welcome modern Samaritans into our lives and our community. Sinners can't be choosy.
