Self-Praise Stinks

Children at play will bluntly confront a braggart, "Self-praise stinks!" We may feel that way about the Pharisee in today's gospel. His self-praise stinks. But the contrast of the pride of the Pharisee and the humility of the tax collector is not that simple. As all parables, this story is meant to make us think beyond the obvious.

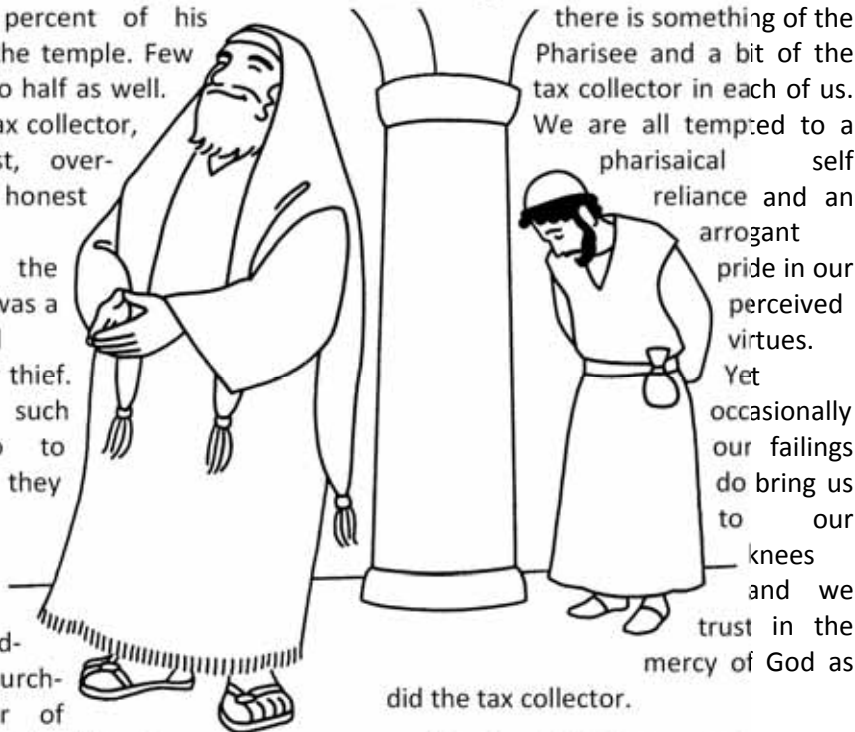
An observant Pharisee fasted from all food and drink two days a week. He gave ten percent of his income to the temple. Few Christians do half as well. A devious tax collector, by contrast, over-taxed honest citizens pocketing the excess. He was a professional white collar thief. Today such people go to prison. If they get caught.

The Pharisee was a hard-working, church-going pillar of the community. The tax collector was a lazy schemer who cheated hard working people. Yet the gospel seems to portray the tax collector as the good guy and the Pharisee as the bad guy. We may be tempted to find in the Pharisee an excuse for not observing the rigors of our faith and in the tax collector a hope to minimize our sins.

But this story does not condemn the Pharisee for his piety, nor excuse the dishonesty of the tax collector. The point is their ultimate trust. The Pharisee trusted in himself; the tax collector trusted in God. That is revealed in the contrast of their

prayers. The Pharisee praised himself; the tax collector praised God. The Pharisee asked nothing from God, because he needed nothing from God. He was his own savior. The tax collector focused his prayer on the mercy of God, admitting his sins knowing that only God could save him.

It is tempting to find examples of the Pharisee and the tax collector in our neighbors. But the truth is that



Good behavior and noble achievements bring with them the temptation to pride and arrogance. Weakness and failure can open hearts to the needs of others and the demands of social justice. These paradoxes are evident in the Pharisee and the tax collector. They might also be found in each of us. "Lord be merciful to me a sinner!"

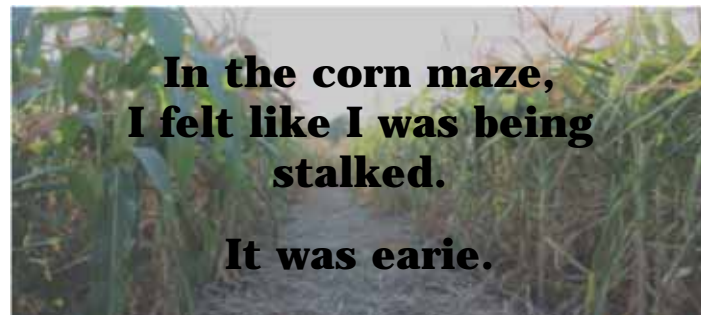

During October—"Respect Life Month", the Bishops of Kansas are asking for as many Kansas Catholics as possible to fill out Petition Postcards to show support for a State Constitutional Amendment.

The amendment language will be clear and concise: there is NOT a right to abortion in the Kansas Constitution.

It is our response to the horrific decision handed down earlier this year in the case of *Hodes & Nauser, MDs v. Schmidt* which allows live dismemberment abortion to continue in Kansas and opens the door for the virtual elimination of all pro-Life legislation in Kansas. SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM



DIOCESE OF SALINA

All those who minister to children or young people on a regular basis are to be educated about the nature of child sexual abuse, how to report it, and strategies for prevention.

The Diocese of Salina currently uses a program called CMGCONNECT, a web-based, on-line training program (along with an integrated background check) that specializes in helping churches, schools, and religious organizations create safe environments for children and youth. High School students in grades 9-12 who work with other minors on a regular basis will do their own training through CMGConnect, which covers safe and appropriate ways to interact with other children.

BEFORE beginning any ministry with children in your parish or school, you must have Safe Environment Training and it must be current (taken within the last 5 years).

A Coffee Legend
Coffee Approved by Pope Clement

“Coffee, the favorite drink of the civilized world.”
 ~ Thomas Jefferson

Coffee grown worldwide can trace its heritage back centuries to the ancient coffee forests on the Ethiopian plateau. There, legend says the goat herder Kaldi first discovered the potential of these beloved beans.

The story goes that that Kaldi discovered coffee after he noticed that after eating the berries from a certain tree, his goats became so energetic that they did not want to sleep at night.

Kaldi reported his findings to the abbot of the local monastery, who made a drink with the berries and found that it kept him alert through the long hours of evening prayer. The abbot shared his discovery with the other monks at the monastery, and knowledge of the energizing berries began to spread.



As word moved east and coffee reached the Arabian peninsula, it began a journey which would bring these beans across the globe.

Coffee was not only enjoyed in homes, but also in the many public coffee houses — called *qahveh khaneh* — which began to appear in cities across the Near East.

Not only did the patrons drink coffee and engage in conversation, but they also listened to music, watched performers, played chess, and kept current on the news. Coffee houses quickly became such an important center for the exchange of information that they were often referred to as “Schools of the Wise.”

Some people reacted to this new beverage with suspicion or fear, calling it the “bitter invention of Satan.” The local clergy condemned coffee when it came to Venice in 1615. The controversy was so great that Pope Clement VIII was asked to intervene. He decided to taste the beverage for himself before making a decision, and found the drink so satisfying that he gave it papal approval.

In the mid-1600's, coffee was brought to New Amsterdam, later called New York by the British.

Though coffee houses rapidly began to appear, tea continued to be the favored drink in the New World until 1773, when the colonists revolted against a heavy tax on tea imposed by King George III. The revolt, known as the Boston Tea Party, would forever change the American drinking preference to coffee.
