The Good Shepherdess

The fourth Sunday of Easter is Good Shepherd Sunday. This year it falls on Mothers Day, which prompts us to see a good mother as a good shepherdess who cares for the flock of her family with love.

The gospels note three marks of the good shepherd: he lays down his life for his sheep; he does not work for pay; he knows his flock. That is also true of good shepherdess mothers. Children acknowledge these blessings from their mother; mothers ponder them as models for their own vocation.

When the gospel says that the Good Shepherd lays down his life for his sheep it means not only that the death of Christ was our salvation but also that his life was given in service to others and as a model for our own living. The good shepherdess lays down her life for her children in service and as an example.

The gospel says that the good shepherd does not work for pay. The shepherd's motive is love, not personal gain. A mother with an infant is a remarkably good image of a good shepherd. Such a mother focuses all her attention, and that of others, on the child. One hardly notices the mother. All the attention is on her child. The only reward she seeks is her child's welfare.

The good shepherdess does not work for pay. You can pay for childcare. Day care centers offer a

service, but they do not replace mothers. Mothers do not provide day care; they provide life care, caring for a life, lifelong. You cannot buy a mother's concern or care. If you could, few could afford it even at the minimum wage, without interest.

Christ says of himself as the good shepherd, "I know mine and mine know me." The instinct that a shepherd has for his flock is an image of the insight mothers have into their children. A mother often knows the mind of her child before the child does. "I know mine and mine know me." Good children reciprocate with concern for their mother.

Too often the value of a good mother is not adequately appreciated in the busy rush of life, but only in retrospect. So we rightly observe a Mother's Day. But cards, candy and carnations are fleeting. How does one express fitting gratitude for the good shepherding of a good mother? By being good sheep, considerate of her needs, returning her service with love, never counting the cost.

Victoria Knights of Columbus Receives State Award

Last weekend Jamey Roth, Knights of Columbus state secretary, and myself attended the State K. of C. convention in Manhattan. The three day event was filled with meetings and social gatherings, as well as a Mass each day.

Victoria Council #1867 was presented a plaque for the "Culture of Life" program top dollar per member. Our local council gave \$5,869 last fraternal year to pro-life causes, which amounts to \$23.86 for each of our council's 246 members. The council's largest donation was toward the January March for Life trip to Washington DC for our youth.

The convention highlight was Friday afternoon when abortion survivor Melissa Ohden, age 41, from Kansas City gave a 50-minute speech about her life. Aborted by the process of a toxic saline solution in 1977, Melissa miraculously survived at 31 weeks. Her adopted parents met her for the first time in the neonatal unit. Today Melissa travels the U.S. telling her story. She has met with President Trump and Congress on pro-life issues. Melissa is "a voice for the voiceless" across our nation.

After Melissa's speech, she spent time outside the convention room where tables of pro-life material were on display. I introduced myself to Melissa and had a nice conversation with her and

her two young daughters present. Nearby was a table of plastic models of various stages of an unborn baby. In talking with Melissa, she touched the model of a baby six inches long on the table and said "This was me. I fit in a hand when I was aborted." I found myself in a moment of life like never before. As we both looked at that model, I unintentionally became speechless, only to let the solemn silence express my feelings. Melissa's speech started the convention, and the impact carried throughout, as attendees kept talking about our influential time with Melissa Friday afternoon.

Pro-life is the backbone of the Knights of Columbus. Our local Victoria Council is proud to support local pro-life efforts such as the Mary Elizabeth Maternity Home, donations toward sonogram machines, and the March for Life for our youth. We thank

the Victoria community and surrounding communities for supporting our fundraisers to make our donations possible. The three Lenten fish fries, the Herzogfest stand, and the Cash-Giveaway in November have all been an annual success! The community support towards the K. of C. made possible our Culture of Life award at the state convention.
