“Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come.”

(from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 24:37-44)



Surprise! Surprise! That shout can announce great joy, as an unexpected birthday party or an extravagant gift. It can also be a great disappointment in that one's hopes will not be realized, as when an invoice is greater than expected or when another captures the prize desired. Surprises can be pleasant and unpleasant.

The gospel message for this first Sunday of Advent is that this will be a season of surprises. "Stay awake! You do not know on which day your Lord will come. You must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." The Lord will come to us at a time and in a way that we least expect. Advent will be full of surprises.

The coming of the Lord in this Advent season is three-fold: his coming in glory at the end of time; his coming in human form on the first Christmas; and his coming each day into our own personal lives. Those are the three Advents of the Lord.

While we should never lose sight of the Lord in those first two Advents—His return at the end of time and his birth in Bethlehem—our present personal Advent vigilance is for his coming into our lives each day, especially his rebirth in our hearts this Advent season. The Lord will come this Advent at a time and in a way that you least expected. Advent will be full of surprises.

We are now busy preparing for Christmas, perhaps too busy. We have our own designs on how best to celebrate the holidays: what to buy, how to decorate, where to celebrate. Yet the Lord will come to us in this season not according to our human designs but according to his divine plan. Today's gospel reminds that he will come to you according to his plan not yours. Advent will be full of surprises.

Some plan that Christmas will come to them in the joy of a festive meal. But the Lord might come to you in the hunger of a beggar. Your design might be that the latest toy will give joy to your children. But the Lord might delight them with the wonder of a baby in a manger. You may rejoice these holidays in your health and good fortune. But the Lord may reveal himself to you in the courage of the sick and the struggle of the needy. The Lord will come to you at a time and in a way that you least expect. Advent will be full of surprises.

We should not deceive ourselves into thinking that we can program the grace of God so that our own designs will create Christmas. The grace of God will come to us this Advent in God's own mysterious way. We do need to prepare for Christmas, not with frantic shopping but with a vigilant soul. "Stay awake! You do not know on which day your Lord will come." Advent will be full of surprises.

The gospel for this first Sunday of Advent reminds us that the coming of the Lord in this season will be a surprise. He will come, perhaps not in your favorite gift, but in a favor of grace; perhaps not in hearty caroling, but in a holy silence; perhaps not in reveling with warm friends, but in renewing a weary faith. Christmas in your heart will not be of your own making. It will be an unexpected gift from the Lord. May your Advent be full of pleasant surprises of God's grace.

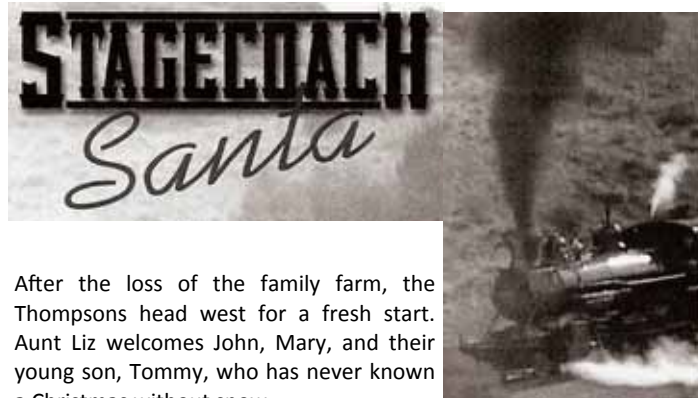

Why do we celebrate Christmas on December 25? How did Saint Nicholas become Santa Claus? Why do we have Christmas trees? *Charting Christmas* provides answers to these questions and many more as it explores the history of Christmas.

Filmed on location in the Holy Land and the United Kingdom, this documentary traces the origins of Christmas traditions beginning with the biblical prophecies concerning the Messiah and the New Testament accounts of His birth. See how Christmas celebrations evolved through the ages and were influenced by notable figures and entities including Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint Boniface, Charles Dickens, and even the Coca-Cola Corporation. Included are interviews with biblical scholars and historians, such as author and Bible teacher Lance Lambert and Canon Jim Rosenthal, founder of the St. Nicholas Society. Their commentaries illuminate the origins of Christmas and tell us why we celebrate as we do today.
