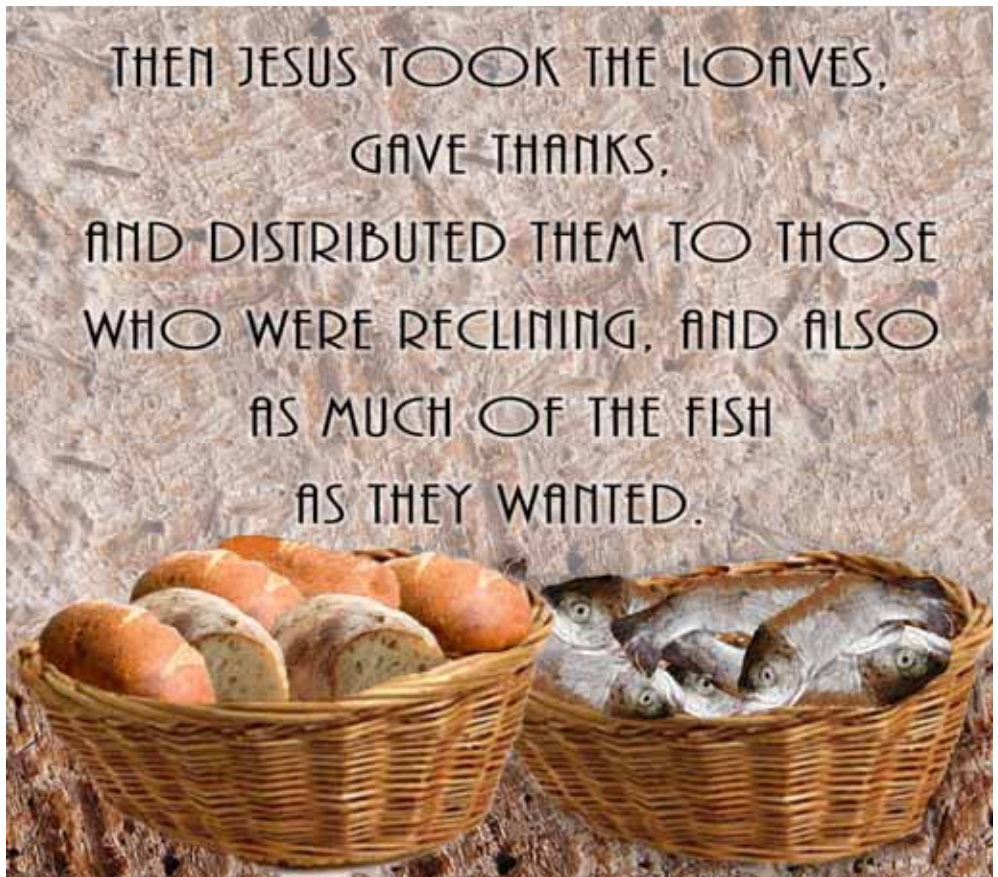

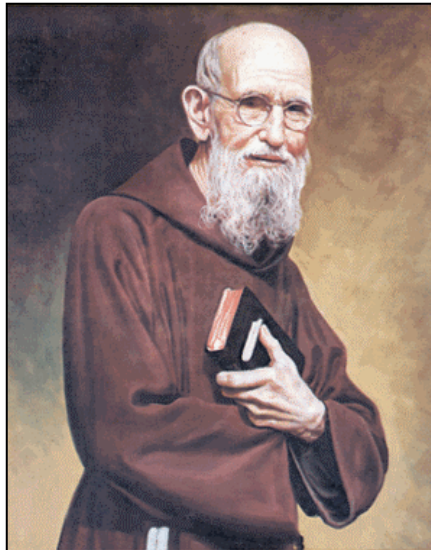


Monday, July 30, is the feast of Blessed Solanus Casey, an American Capuchin priest. He was raised to the honor of *Blessed*, a preliminary step to canonization, by Pope Francis on November 18, 2017. There are 16 Capuchin Saints and more than 100 Blessed, but Fr. Solanus Casey is the first American.

He was baptized Bernard Francis Casey, the oldest of 16 children in an Irish family from Superior, Wisconsin. During his early careers as a lumberjack, a prison guard, and a streetcar motorman, he saw much cruelty, violence, and hatred. He decided that "the only cure for human sin and vice is the love that can be learned only from and through Him who died to show us what love is."

Believing that he was called to dedicate his life to God's service, he decided to study for the priesthood in the Capuchin Order. But he struggled academically and his superiors restricted his priestly duties after he was ordained. He was permitted to say Mass publicly, but not allowed to preach or hear confessions.

Undeterred, he began a prayer group which grew rapidly and reported marvelous answers to their petitions. Father Solanus soon found himself at the center of unusual spiritual activity and his superiors directed him to keep a record of these "special favors." He recorded thousands of requests and about 700 of those reported cures from serious illness, personal struggles, and faith conversions. Some were quite dramatic. In 1994 the TV program *Unsolved Mysteries* aired a program, "The Mysterious Powers of Father Solanus."



In his letters to those who requested his intercession he repeated his basic theme that confidence in God is the very soul of prayer and becomes the condition for supernatural intervention in our lives. "God condescends to use our powers if we don't spoil his plans by ours," he frequently wrote.

Fr. Solanus loved to play the violin at the amateur level. Fellow friars who heard him play, if not impressed with his artistic skill, were moved with his sincere effort to please others and to praise God with his music.

Father Solanus died July 31, 1957, on the 53rd anniversary of his first Mass. After his death, Clare Ryan, who is confident that she was cured of terminal cancer through his intercession, started the *Father Solanus Guild* to continue devotion to this saintly priest. Reports of favors granted through prayers to Fr. Solanus multiplied and the guild, with thousands of members nationally, began to promote his canonization.

In 1995 Pope John Paul II declared that the heroic virtues of Fr. Solanus Casey merited the title *Venerable*. On November 18, 2017, Pope Francis pronounced him *Blessed*, the second step in the process toward canonization. If he is declared a saint, he will be the first American-born man so honored. The first American saint, canonized in 1946, was Mother Cabrini, a naturalized citizen. The first American-born saint was Elizabeth Ann Seton canonized in 1976. Apparently, it takes men quite a while to catch up in sanctity.



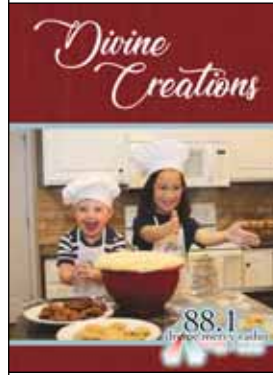
