Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed.



Today's gospel is the only Sunday gospel that is read on all three years of the liturgical cycle. Even Christmas and Easter offer alternate gospels, but the Second Sunday of Easter is always the story of the Doubting Thomas (Jn 20:19-31). This captivating story, only in John's gospel, offers many points of reflection and raises some interesting questions.

Why was Thomas not with the other apostles when the Lord first appeared to them? Had he given up on his community of faith which the Lord had founded? If Thomas had such a difficulty, ultimately he returned and made the boldest profession of faith of all the apostles, "My Lord and my God." Perhaps he represents disenchanted Catholics who withdraw from their parish community and stop attending church. Many who return after a lapse of practicing the faith often have a deeper conviction than routine Catholics.

And why did the Lord wait a week to reappear in the presence of Thomas? Why not get this over and done with at once? Perhaps Christ was allowing Thomas time to work through his struggle of faith. We are not all ready at the same moment to make a lasting faith commitment. The personal circumstances of one's life, the opportunities for religious education and for faith development affect one's ability to commit to the responsibilities of faith. Not all the workers in the vineyard began at the first hour, yet all received the same reward.

What about the other apostles? Were their words to Thomas a vain boast? "We have seen the Lord." Were they taunting Thomas, claiming to be more favored apostles than he? The manner in which we outwardly profess our faith affects others. We can edify them or embarrass them. It takes great prudence to challenge unbelievers without turning them off. Good example must be given in a good manner.

Should Thomas be honored as a model, even a saint? Belief is a virtue. Has doubt now somehow become a virtue? Doubt may not be a virtue in and of itself, but doubt is an essential part of an authentic faith. St. Philip Neri wrote, "Our faith owes more to the doubts of Thomas than to the belief of all the other Apostles." How can that be true?

Our doubts must be admitted and engaged if our faith is to grow. An unexamined faith is not an authentic faith. A thousand doubts do not make a single denial. The doubting apostle Thomas is offered as a model for modern Christians who raise honest questions from the perspective of a sincere faith. It is significant that Thomas doubted. It is more important that ultimately he believed.

Finally, the question of Jesus, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." That may appear to be a rebuke of Thomas. But is it? Thomas was deprived of the first appearance of Christ to the apostles. He had not seen when the others had. Yet eventually he did believe. He doubted, but he did not despair. A thousand doubts do not make a single denial. Christ's words may be a subtle blessing of Thomas. Perhaps Christ is blessing not so much those who have never doubted, but more so those whose struggle with faith has led them to the deeper faith of Thomas, "My Lord and my God."


Victoria Elementary Still Collecting Box Tops
