(from the Holy Gospel according to Luke 13:1-9)



In recent years there has been a flurry of books by the self-styled new atheists. The only thing new is the paradox of their religious zeal for atheism. The old atheists—Spinoza, Nietzsche, Voltaire—were much more profound. It was Nietzsche, who said, “The atheist has only one question for the Christian. Not the divinity of Christ, not the Trinity, not the Eucharist. The one question is this: Why is there suffering? How can you reconcile an all good and merciful God with human suffering?” Their question deserves an answer.

Why is there suffering? That is the implicit question in today’s gospel. It tells of Pilate ruthlessly slaughtering ten Galileans, and a tower collapsing at Siloam killing eighteen people. People then, as now, want to know why such meaningless suffering.

Some consider suffering to be a punishment from God. Tell a lie, get a sore throat; steal a cookie, have an upset stomach; skip Sunday Mass, lose at golf. That isn’t faith. That’s superstition. Christ insisted that the tragedies in today’s gospel were not a punishment, “Do you think they were more guilty than anyone else? Certainly not.” Human suffering is **not** a punishment from God for personal sin. That is true of natural disasters, fatal diseases, and technical tragedy.

But how to answer the atheist’s question, “Why is there suffering?” Here is the theological answer: We don’t know. Some may find that disappointing, but that is the very point of the theology of suffering. An essential component of suffering is not knowing why. Suffering is a mystery within the wisdom of God.

If divinity were entirely within the realm of human logic, comparable to a higher level of mathematics, then any genius could comprehend the mind of God. But such a God is not the God of Christian faith. The God that atheists do not believe in, Christians do not believe in, a God confined within human knowledge. Comprehending the infinite God with a finite mind is a contradiction. The God of Scripture is transcendent, beyond the level of our existence.

Why is there human suffering? We don’t know. But we do know that suffering is intrinsic to the human condition. It is an inescapable part of our fallen state. Christians do not know why that is so, but Christians believe that God is with us in our fallen human state. Jesus of Nazareth became incarnate. God is with us in our suffering.

Why is there suffering? That is not the ultimate question about suffering. Atheists are not asking the really tough question. The real question is, “Why did Jesus of Nazareth suffer?” The just for the unjust, the innocent for the guilty. “Why did Jesus of Nazareth suffer?” In the atheist’s godless world the only answer is that life is meaningless and people are inherently cruel. That won’t do, not even for a rationalist.

Why did Jesus of Nazareth suffer? That question IS Lent. And the answer is called the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ which gives meaning to our existence as we relive that mystery in our own life. In his encyclical *fides et ratio* Pope John Paul II wrote, “Faith and reason are the two wings on which we can soar above a meaningless existence.”

Why is there human suffering? We don’t know. We believe.
