

## Catechetical Sunday

The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones.



## Friars' Mind

The gospel parables are often unsettling. Today's parable seems to approve of the shady business dealings of the steward and it even proposes him as a model for Christians. Some Scripture scholars hold that the steward was not doing anything wrong. He was simply subtracting his own commission from each of the debts. He was letting the debtors have their merchandise wholesale, foregoing his personal profit to gain the good favor of his clients.

But most Scripture scholars insist that the steward was dishonest, yet the parable is not approving of his dishonesty. It is praising only his clever initiative. We might have difficulty separating his dishonesty from his ingenuity, but the Semitic culture of gospel times apparently did not.

All commentators agree that the moral of the parable is that we should be as inventive spiritually as we are materially. Too often we are not. The central verse of this gospel is: "The children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light."

The obvious meaning of that verse is that unbelievers are more diligent in their material dealings, than Christians are in spiritual matters. Terrorists, for example, are more inventive in their scheming than our technicians are in our security; abortion advocates are more imaginative than pro-life activists; the unscrupulous in business are daring while honest merchants are dull.

In sum, pagans are better at being pagan than Christians are at being Christian. That is a valid understanding of this gospel. But there is also a personal application. The comparison should be not only between pagans and Christians. It should be addressed to the secular ingenuity within each of us. Do we develop our spiritual life as well as we manage our material business?

Most of us are good planners, good shoppers, and good organizers. We spend our time, our resources, and our money wisely. Are we as prudent and persistent in prayer and charity and mercy? Whatever your trade - a butcher or a baker or a candlestick maker - you pride yourself on the quality of your work. The gospel is asking if you have the same dedication to the values and virtues of your interior Christian life.

The gospel suggests that the worldly part of me is better at dealing with the material part of my life, than the spiritual part of me is in dealing with my inner spirit. "The children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light."

Despite this human weakness, many good things are happening in the Christian world. Most of our parishes are thriving with creative ideas to better our liturgies, our religious education, and our service to the community. Today's gospel is not a condemnation, but a counsel. If we are aware of our weaknesses, we are better able to develop our strengths. In the paradoxical words of St. Francis, "Let us begin again, for up to now we have done nothing. May each of us do our share to spread the gospel."

## Second Collection for Louisiana Flood Victims

As many as 60,000 homes have been damaged in the flooding in Louisiana with 20,000 people rescued from flood waters. Lives have been cruelly altered. In light of the devastation, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has directed that every Diocese in the U.S. is to take up a second collection for the victims **this weekend—September 17-18**. This emergency collection will be used both to support the humanitarian efforts of Catholic Charities USA and to provide pastoral and rebuilding support to impacted dioceses in the area.




