Tomorrow the Church celebrates the feast of St. Joseph, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Actually his feast day is today, March 19, but since it falls on a Sunday of Lent the celebration is transferred to the following day.

St. Joseph has been honored by Christians since the earliest days, but his official feast on March 19 for the whole church dates from the 10th century. There is also a feast of St. Joseph on May 1 established by Pope Pius XI in 1955 under the title of St. Joseph the Worker. He was declared the patron of the universal church by Pope Pius IX in 1870 and guardian of the Redeemer by Pope John Paul II in 1989. He is honored as the patron of workers, carpenters, the dying, fathers, and travelers; also of Austria, Bohemia, Belgium, Canada, Mexico, Peru, and South Vietnam.

Joseph is a pivotal character in the first and second chapters of the gospel of Matthew and Luke. In the genealogy of Christ he is listed as Joseph the son of Jacob. He is featured prominently in the delicate question of his betrothal to Mary, the trip to Bethlehem, the Birth of Christ, the flight into Egypt, and the return to Nazareth. St. Joseph does not appear again in the gospels during the public life of Christ, although the gospel of John refers to Jesus as the son of Joseph.

In some early Christian writings, which are of dubious historical accuracy, Joseph is described as a widower advanced in age when he is selected to be the husband of Mary by a miraculous lily blooming on his staff, as is often pictured in statues of him.

The Eucharistic prayer at Mass has mentioned St. Joseph since early Christianity, but for some reason his name was omitted in the 1962 revision of the Roman Missal. Pope Francis correct that in 2015 when he ordered that the wording of the Eucharistic prayer be changed to include him: "We honor the blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with blessed Joseph, her Spouse."

Saint Joseph may be known to the public more by legends than by factual history. People of any or no faith bury his statute to sell their house, a custom of uncertain origin though some suggest it derives from the change of residence to Bethlehem and then the flight into Egypt. The known facts of his life are few but they are significant. Above all else Saint Joseph is known as *the just man* from the manner in which he dealt with the unexpected pregnancy of Mary his betrothed. In this delicate matter he acted decisively, prudently, quietly, and without causing any public shame to Mary.

Saint Joseph is the only major character in the Gospels who does not speak! Jesus speaks, Mary speaks, John speaks, James speaks, Peter speaks—too often! But Joseph never speaks. He is the spiritual standard for the maxim, "Actions speak louder than words." Pope Benedict XVI wrote: "The silence of Saint Joseph is steeped in the contemplation of the mystery of God. It is a silence of thanks, a silence woven of constant prayer, a prayer of blessing of the Lord, of the adoration of His holy will and of unreserved trust in his providence. In a world that is often too noisy, that encourages neither recollection nor listening to God's voice, let us allow ourselves to be filled with the silence of Saint Joseph."


