Wednesday, October 11, is the feast of Saint John XXIII, popularly known as "Good Pope John." Elected in 1958, following the death of Pius XII, he was expected to serve as an "interim" pontiff. But he surprised the world by summoning the Second Vatican Council to renew the church. While he is well known for opening the church to a new ecumenical spirit here are a few things less known about this beloved pope.

He was born in poverty and was proud of it.

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli, who would become Pope John XXIII, was born in 1881, the third of 13 children in a family of sharecroppers in the village of Bergamo in Lombardy, Italy. Young Roncalli left home to study for the priesthood at the age of 11, but even after he became Pope in 1958 at the age of 76 he eschewed the trappings of his position, and refused to take advantage of it either for himself or his family. In his last will and testament, Pope John XXIII wrote: "Born poor, but of humble and respected folk, I am particularly happy to die poor." When he died in 1963 he left his personal "fortune" to the surviving members of his family—they each received less than \$20.00.



He saved the lives of many Jews fleeing the Nazis.

During the Second World War as head of the Vatican's diplomatic corps in Turkey and Greece, he helped saved the lives of many Jews fleeing the Holocaust by providing them with visas and other documents which allowed them to leave Europe. For this he was given the honor of *Righteous Among Nations* by the Wallenberg Foundation which formally recognizes those who risked their lives to save persecuted Jews. As pope he worked diligently to improve relations between Catholics, Jews, and other faiths.

Strictly speaking, he was not the first Pope John XXIII.

During the late 14th and early 15th centuries the church was politically divided and rival Popes were elected by separate factions, including John XXIII, Gregory XII, and Benedict XIII. Today, Pope Gregory XII is considered the only true pontiff from that period. Benedict XIII and John XXIII are regarded as illegitimate *antipopes*. When cardinal Roncalli was elected pope he chose the name John XXIII, and not John XXIV, to definitively correct the historical record.

Pope John XXIII played a key role in the Cuban Missile Crisis.

In October 1962, with the United States and Russia on the brink of nuclear war, Pope John XXIII helped to bring both countries back from the edge, urging President Kennedy and Nikita Khrushchev to exercise restraint. Just days after the Pope's direct appeal to both leaders, Khrushchev withdrew Russian missiles from Cuba. Historians recognize the effort of Pope John XXIII as among those that help to defuse the crisis.

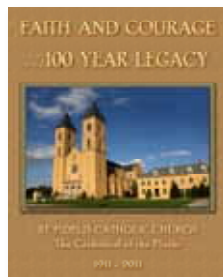

PLENARY INDULGENCE GIVEN WHEN VISITING A BASILICA

The faithful may obtain a plenary indulgence by visiting a minor basilica. An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment for a previously forgiven sin. To obtain a plenary indulgence during a pilgrimage to a basilica, one must participate in any sacred rite or recite the Lord's Prayer or the profession of faith while there, then go to Confession and Communion and pray for the intention of the pope.

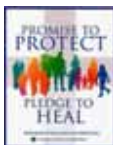
