In today's gospel the risen Christ appears to two of his disciples and explains to them the meaning of his life, death, and resurrection. "Recall those words I spoke to you when I was still with you: everything written about me in the law of Moses and the prophets and the psalms had to be filled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. (Lk 24: 42)

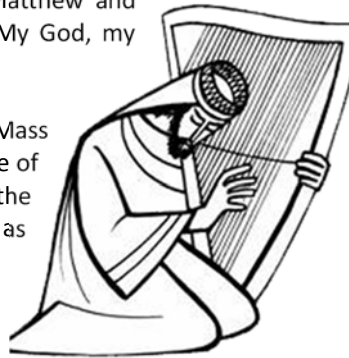
*Be Still*  
AND KNOW  
THAT I AM GOD

"The law, the prophets, and the psalms." That is the summary of the Sacred Scriptures by the Lord himself. Scripture scholars traditionally outline the Bible as the law, the prophets, and the wisdom literature. The wisdom books include: Proverbs, Job, Ecclesiastes, Sirach, Wisdom, and the Book of Psalms. The psalms are wisdom literature par excellence.

Not only did the Lord place the psalms at the heart of Scripture along with the law and the prophets, he also quoted from the psalms more often than any other book of the Bible. More than Exodus (7) and Isaiah (8), Jesus quoted the Psalms (11) eleven times. The New Testament authors quoted from the psalms 55 times and referred to a specific psalm another seventy times totaling more than one hundred citations, far exceeding any other book of the Old Testament.

The gospel of Mark quotes the psalms 10 times, Matthew 15, John 15, and Luke 30. Saint Peter cited the psalms in his sermons in the Acts of the Apostles and in his epistles. Saint Paul also cited the psalms in his discourse in Acts and 26 times in his epistles. The Letter to the Hebrews quotes the psalms 19 times in an elegant theology of Christ our eternal high priest.

As any devout Jew of his time, Jesus prayed the psalms when he went to the temple or the synagogue or celebrated the Seder. Following the Last Supper, Mark's gospel observes, "After singing *songs of praise*, they walked out to the Mount of Olives." (Mk 14:26) The *songs of praise* at the Passover were Psalms 113-118. Matthew and Mark tell us that while dying on the cross Jesus cried, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me." (Ps 22:1)



The only book of the Bible that we read from at every Mass is the Book of Psalms. Yes, we always read a gospel, but one of four. Psalms are also the heart of the Liturgy of the Hours, the daily prayer of the church. No book of the Bible is as prominent in our liturgy as the psalms.

The Book of Psalms is referred to as the Prayer Book of the Bible. The psalms of praise extol God's wonders in myriad ways; the royal psalms are as varied as the glory of the Messiah; and the penitential psalms are as diverse as our sins. Saint Ambrose wrote that the psalms are "the gymnasium of the soul." If you want to complain, there is a psalm. If you want to repent, there is a psalm. And if you want to rejoice, there are many psalms.

If you are distracted and restless at prayer, try meditating on a psalm. It "will set your soul in silence and peace as a child rests in its mother's arms." (Ps 131:2)

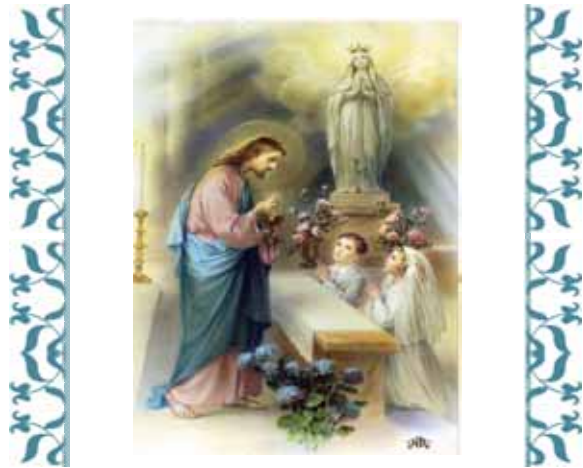
*A special thank you to Mrs. Becky Scheck, our second grade catechist, and the Jubilee Choir:*
