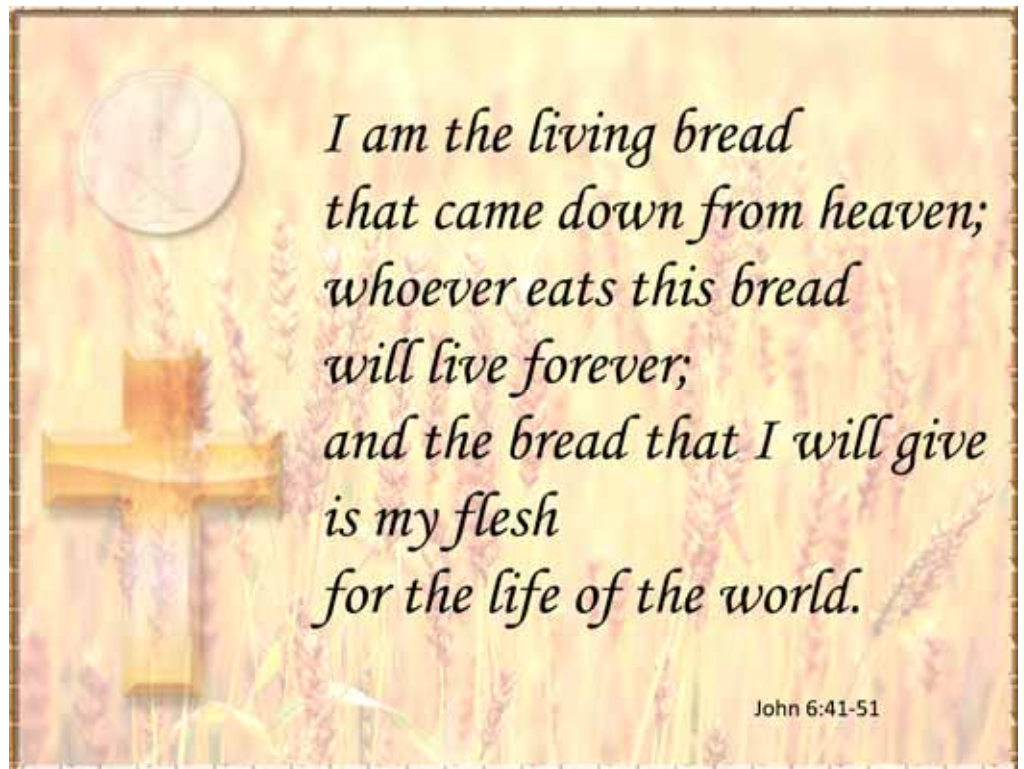

When the militant atheist Eugenio Scalfari challenged Pope Benedict XVI to give just one good reason why unbelievers should consider the Catholic faith, the Pope replied, "I will offer two: our saints and our art." The saints are well known models of our faith, but the art inspired by our faith needs more reflection as a demonstration of our beliefs.

The Assumption of Mary, celebrated this Wednesday, is a timely example. There are many paintings of Mary's assumption, but the most famous is that of the Italian Renaissance artist Titian. A miniature is shown here in black and white; color reproductions can be found online.

Pope Pius XII explained the Assumption as follows: "Since Mary completely overcame sin by the unique privilege of her Immaculate Conception and a sinless life, she was not subject to the corruption of the grave which is a consequence of sin. She did not have to wait until the end of time for the redemption her body." He did not specify whether Mary was assumed into heaven before or after a natural death. Titan unwittingly honored that ambiguity with a sarcophagus at the base of his picture which may be symbolic of either.

Titian's painting has three parts divided by soft layers of light. On the ground are the apostles in a variety of poses: gazing in awe, kneeling, and reaching for the skies. Saint Peter is at their center with hands in prayer; St. John is the young man in red to his left reaching to the Virgin. The other apostles are deliberately anonymous, representing all Christians.

In the center frame the Virgin Mary rises on clouds, wrapped in a red robe with a blue mantle, arms in a gesture of astonishment. Around her throngs of angels are mingled with clouds radiating heavenly light. At the top an angel is handing Mary's crown to God the Father.



This painting is often compared to Raphael's Transfiguration of Christ, which is also shown here in miniature. In both paintings the radiant main figure soars above a crowd of marveling disciples. The similarity is fitting since the Assumption of Mary shares in the glory of the transfigured Christ. The prayer for this feast of Mary not only honors Christ and his mother but also renews our hope that we may share in their heavenly glory:

*O God who chose the Blessed Virgin Mary as the mother of your only begotten Son according to the flesh, and crowned her with heavenly glory, grant through her prayers, that, saved by the mystery of*

*Christ's redemption, we may be raised by you to share their glory. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, who reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever. Amen.*

### LEARN: Abortion is not health care.

Abortion advocates speak as if abortion is health care, a procedure that is morally and emotionally equivalent to surgically removing one's tonsils or appendix. It is often conveyed as so morally neutral that only a few religious outliers find it objectionable. Yet in reality, the vast majority, over 85%, of OB/GYNs, coming from many faiths or no faith refuse to be associated with or perform an abortion.<sup>1</sup> In addition, according to the pro-abortion Guttmacher Institute, 86% of hospitals were not involved in abortion.<sup>2</sup> Finally, even Roe acknowledges that abortion is unlike other procedures performed by a health professional and that unborn children deserve some protection.<sup>3</sup> Abortion is not health care and we do a disservice to women and health care providers to pretend it is.

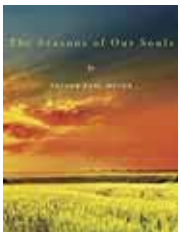
