The Unforgivable Sin

Today's gospel refers to the sin against the Holy Spirit as the one unforgivable sin, which confuses many good people. This sin is referred to not only in the gospels but also in the Letter to the Hebrews and the First Letter of Saint John.

The gospel passages are: "Anyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven, but anyone who speaks against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come." (Mt 12:32) "All sins and blasphemies will be forgiven. But whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never be forgiven, but is guilty of an eternal sin." (Mk 3:30) "Whoever speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven, but anyone who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven." (Lk 12:10)

The other references are: "It is impossible for those who have shared the Holy Spirit and then have fallen away to come to repentance again." (Heb 6:6) "If we sin deliberately after receiving knowledge of the truth there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins." (Heb 10:26) "There is such a thing as deadly sin about which I do not say that you should pray."(1 Jn 5:17)

What is this sin against the Holy Spirit and why is it unforgivable? In the context of the gospel passages it was the sin of the Pharisees in attributing the work of the Holy Spirit in Jesus' miracles to the power of Satan. That was their blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. The sin against the Holy Spirit in the larger context is denying the power of the Holy Spirit, limiting the possibility of God's grace, refusing to be forgiven.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says "there are no limits to the mercy of God, but anyone who deliberately refuses to accept his mercy by repenting, rejects the forgiveness of his sins and the salvation offered by the Holy Spirit. Such hardness of heart can lead to final impenitence and eternal loss." (#1864)

St. Thomas Aquinas gave three examples of this unforgivable sin: *despair*, which consists in thinking that one's own malice is greater than God's mercy; *presumption*, expecting glory without merit or pardon without repentance; and *obstinacy*, hardened resistance to grace.

The unforgivable sin of blasphemy against the Holy Spirit does not consist of evil words. It is the refusal to accept the salvation which God offers through the Holy Spirit. This sin cannot be forgiven in this life or in the next because it is the radical refusal to be converted. This is not a punishment that God inflicts on the sinner, but a refusal of the sinner to accept God's mercy. It is not what God does to the sinner, but what the sinner does to himself.
