The Parish Office will be closed for the Easter holiday from Holy Thursday, March 29, at noon through Easter Monday, April 2



The highest attendance at Catholic churches is on Easter Sunday. That is in harmony with our theology since the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is the foundation of our faith. Other days of high attendance are Christmas, Ash Wednesday, and Palm Sunday. Unfortunately missing from the list are: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Holy Saturday Easter vigil. Together, known as the Sacred Triduum, they celebrate the core belief of our faith.

Holy Thursday is the celebration of the Lord's Supper, popularly known as the Last Supper, when the sacraments of Eucharist and priesthood were instituted by Christ. The celebration features the washing of feet, symbolic of the new commandment of love in service.



Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of Christ with the veneration of the cross. The reading of the Passion of the Lord is from the gospel of John which focuses on the positive meaning of the death of Christ, his triumph over evil and sin, hence Good Friday.



The Easter Vigil, the principal liturgical celebration of the year, recalls the Resurrection of Christ with symbols of fire and light and water. The Easter Candle, Christ our Light, dispels the darkness of sin and death, and a new life of grace is offered in the waters of baptism.



It is significant that Christianity is based on historical events. But our observance of Holy Week is more than a remembrance or a reenactment of those stories. The liturgies do not simply "take us back" to the upper room, Calvary, or the empty tomb. Holy Week celebrates the message, the meaning, and the metanoia—the change of heart those stories can evoke.

The church celebrates not simply the history but the unseen reality behind those visible events, the spiritual design of God acting in the world, a pattern to be lived anew in our own lives. The foundation of our faith is the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is not only the cornerstone of the Christian faith, but the template of the life of all the baptized. Saint Paul wrote, "If we died with Christ we believe that we shall also live with him." (Rm 6:8) That is what we proclaim during Holy Week.

We remember what once happened to Jesus of Nazareth to help us focus on what should happen to us now. We are to be a people of faith, called to conversion, and animated with his grace for charity. We celebrate God's presence in our hearts, sustaining us as a faith community, rich in compassion, steadfast in hope, and committed to peace and justice in our world.

If you want to know what we believe as Christians and Catholics, it is in the Triduum. If you want to understand the meaning of the life and death of Jesus Christ, it is in the Triduum. If you want to renew your faith, it is in the celebration of the Triduum.

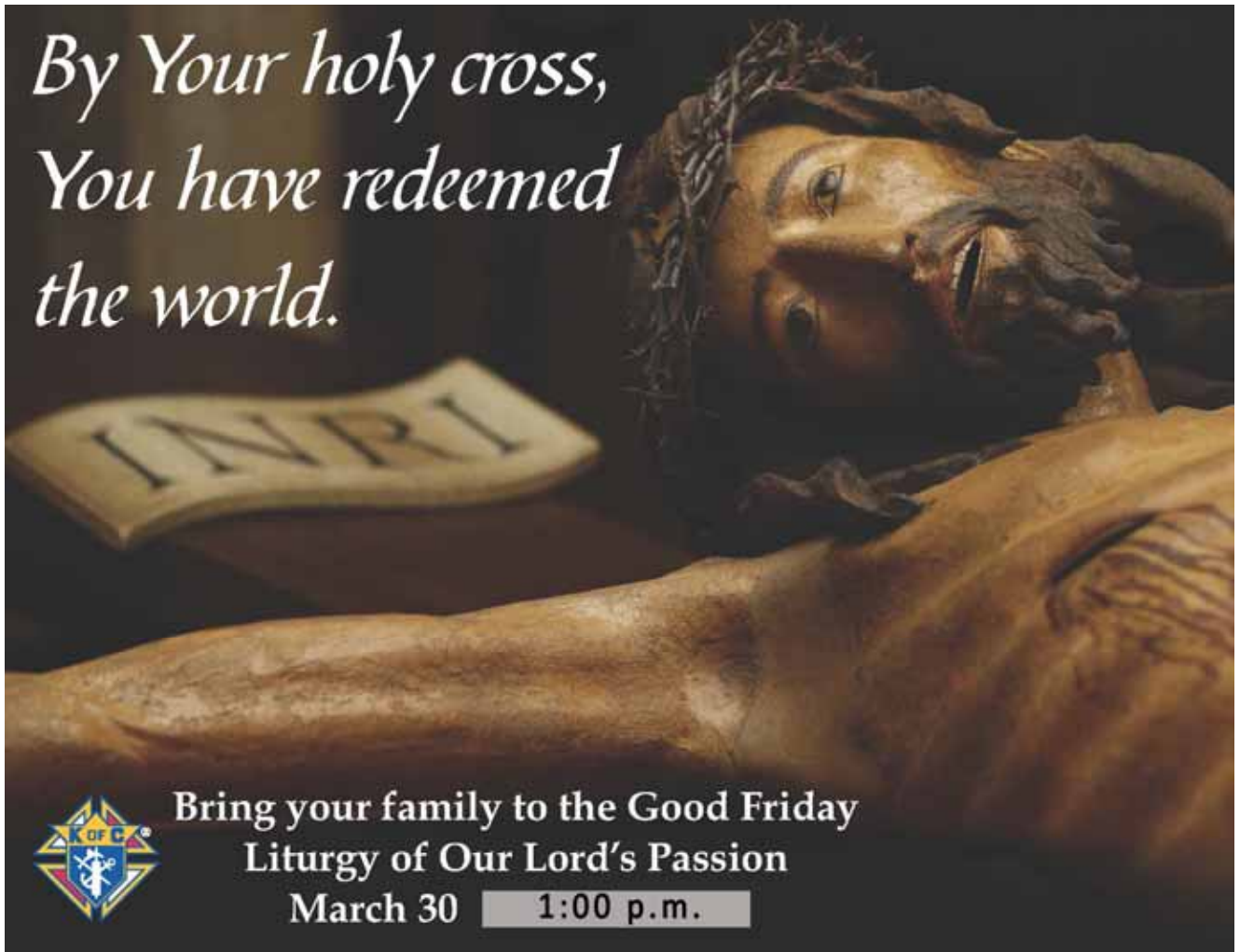

Who can attend? Children of our tri-parish communities—Victoria, Walker, and Vincent—in grades K – 5 during the 2017-2018 school year, are welcome to attend.

What is a Catholic Vacation Bible School (VBS)?

It is NOT summer school! ;) It’s a whole week that our volunteers dedicate to teaching the children about their Catholic faith through games, crafts, music, prayers, skits, and even snacks. All of these enhance the theme of the VBS! At this particular VBS, the children will have a better understanding of the seven sacraments while deepening their understanding and love for Jesus.

How do I sign my child(ren) up?

Pre-registration forms will go home with all children in religion on Wednesday, April 4. Please return these forms to the Religious Ed Office by the last day of religion, Wednesday, April 25. As Jeanette receives these forms, or by April 25, she will mail your family the necessary registration forms (as required by the Diocese of Salina). **If your child(ren) is/are not enrolled in Religious Ed, but you are a parishioner of St. Fidelis, St. Ann, or St. Boniface and would like for your child(ren) to attend – please contact Jeanette Brungardt and she’ll be happy to sign your family up! ☺**

How can you help or volunteer?

Volunteers (6th grade and older) may apply with Jeanette Brungardt in the Religious Ed Office. A variety of positions are available. Knowing your talents, interests, age (for ex: middle school, high school youth, or adults 25 years +), and comfort level will help Jeanette and you decide how you can help. Volunteers may help all week long or only on specific days; it’s based on your availability.

Adults, 25 years +: Must have completed a background check and online training through the diocese within the last 5 years. If not, this **must be completed prior** to the Vacation Bible School [no exceptions]. Jeanette will be happy to give you the instructions & paperwork needed.

Youth, 9th grade and older: must complete online training, since they are volunteering with minors, prior to the Vacation Bible School. This is a new requirement by the diocese eff. Fall/’17.

Monetary donations are appreciated, too, as this VBS is completely free for our children and it does come with added expenses to St. Fidelis and the Religious Ed Office.

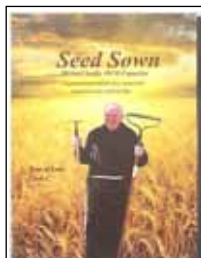
