## The Devil and His Demons

This Sunday we read the story of the first miracle in the Gospel of Mark where Jesus cast out the demon of a possessed man. In the gospels Jesus frequently confronts demons and frees those possessed. There are seven such exorcisms, more than any other type of miracle. Christ gave sight to the blind three times, cured the paralyzed three times, and twice multiplied the loaves and fish. We seldom hear of demons today, so we wonder why there were many in the gospels.



There is a subtle clue in today's gospel story: the demon knew who Christ was. "I know who you are, the Holy One of God." (Mk1:24) The forces of evil seldom allow goodness to go unchallenged. In the gospel of Luke it is clear that the primary struggle in the life of Jesus is with the devil, beginning with the three temptations in the desert to the tragic events of Holy Week where Luke mentions Satan three times.

Another consideration is the culture of the time when those

accounts were written. In that age it was common to refer to any serious problem as the work of evil spirits. Demons were thought to be the force behind blindness, paralysis, even death. Today we have precise scientific terms for every illness: carcinoma, influenza, epilepsy. Yet simply giving a name to an aberration of nature does not explain why it has occurred. The ancients might well respond to our scientific perspective, "Yes, carcinoma. But *why* is there cancer? *Why* is there COVID-19? *Why* does nature malfunction?" Science knows the *what*, but not the *why*.

It is not uncommon today for even sophisticated people to refer to overwhelming personal or medical problems analogously as evil spirits. We speak of the demons of addiction, obsessive compulsions, even gossip. And we all struggle with our own inner demons. Sudden irrational impulses to unruly behavior we often humorously attribute to demons, "The devil made me do it."

Pope Francis, to the bewilderment of his progressive admirers, frequently refers to the threats of the devil. "Many have been led to believe that the devil is a myth, but the devil exists." "The devil uses envy to try to thwart the proclamation of the Gospel." "The great gossip is the devil." "Never dialogue with the devil."

Evil is a reality in our world, although it is often masked as a good, which can deceive us into being part of it. In a spiritual sense, we need Christ to come again and cast out the demons that tempt us to compromise our faith.

## SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION

The dispensation given for all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect until it is safe to lift it. The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation continues because the Church does not want to place a moral burden on those who should not attend Sunday Mass because of age or health conditions.

**However, Catholics are still obliged to keep the Commandments, including the Commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day.** Families who choose not to attend Mass should conduct a Liturgy of the Word in the home. Individuals and families should spend additional time in prayer, pious devotions, and spiritual reading on Sunday. Younger adults who are least at risk from the virus should take advantage of the opportunity to participate in person at Mass and to receive Holy Communion if they are properly disposed. If those in good health are attending other large social gatherings, they should also be participating at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays.

***For those attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, we expect to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks in church.***

### Low-Income Energy Assistance Program

The program for individuals who need help paying for heat in their homes this winter has started. **Applications will be accepted from January 4 to March 31.** People who received assistance last year should have received an application in the mail this year.

Income eligibility begins at \$1,383 gross monthly income for a single person living at an address. The income varies based on the number of people in a home. For a group of four the income level is \$2,839 gross.

Applications can also be picked up at the local Department of Children and Families (DCF) Office which is located southeast of the Hays Medical Center.

Last year, 34,000 households received an average benefit of \$960.
