



Good Shepherds

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is celebrated each year as Good Shepherd Sunday. The liturgical cycle of readings offers three different passages from the gospel of John where Christ explains the different

ways that he is the shepherd of his followers.

He first describes himself as the gate for the sheep, guarding who enters to protect his flock. He then assures us that he knows the sheep calling each by name as they recognize his voice and follow him. Finally, he reminds us that he will lay down his life for his sheep and unite a divided flock.

The gospel reading this year

is the only biblical passage in which Christ says that he is the *Good Shepherd.* The popular twenty-third Psalm, although known as the Good Shepherd Psalm, does not use the words *Good Shepherd.* Nor do the many other gospel passages that present Christ in the image of a shepherd. But in today's reading Christ says three times, "I am the good shepherd." And that verse has become the iconic image of Christ as our Savior.

While Christ refers to himself three times in today's gospel as the *Good Shepherd*, it is also significant that five times he reminds us that as the shepherd he will lay down his life for his sheep. It is the bond between these images of Christ as the good shepherd and the Paschal Lamb sacrificed for others that we celebrate during this Easter season.

A shepherd offering his life for his sheep is found in various settings in the gospels. During the last Supper, for example, Christ reminded his apostle of the prophecy regarding his

> approaching hour of death and their abandoning him at that crucial time, "I will strike the shepherd and the sheep will be dispersed." (Mk 14:27 citing Zec 13:7) Later when Christ

commissioned St. Peter to be the shepherd of the church, he reminded him of the martyr's death that this office would bring upon him. (Jn 21:19)

While these

scriptures tell us that Christ and many of the apostles have given their lives as shepherds of the faithful, they also remind us that living our faith requires sacrifice, at times even a heroic sacrifice. If you are the shepherd or shepherdess of your family, your students, your business, etc., it will entail hardships as well as rewards. As faithful followers of Christ, the Good Shepherds who offer unselfish service graciously. "A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." (Jn 10:11)



April 26 Day of Prayer in Atonement for Those Harmed by Sexual Abuse

From the Diocese Safe Environment Office:

Friday, April 26, is a day to devote to prayer for those harmed by sexual abuse in the Catholic Church. The April date was chosen because April is also Child Abuse Prevention month. ... Petitions at Mass will include prayers for atonement for any grave harm caused by members of the Church as well as for the healing of those who have suffered and continue to suffer because of past sexual abuse. We continue to remain hopeful, but to never forget the pain, the sorrow, and devastation sexual abuse causes for many in our Catholic communities. ...

We pray for ongoing efforts in the healing and reconciliation of those who have suffered this betrayal of trust. We pray for continued success of the Church's prevention efforts in making safer environments for our children and educating adults to support awareness of sexual abuse.

We will never really know how many victims or survivors there are, as many people hold this personal harm in private. As masses, prayers, and petitions are offered, we are hopeful that those harmed may experience God's healing love.

April Is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Did you know... The Catholic Church is deeply committed to protecting children from abuse and holding people accountable for inflicting such pain. In December 2021, the revised Book VI of the Code of Canon Law went into effect. This is the most recent of several documents that specifically address the issue of the abuse of children. Other documents include Vos estis lux mundi and Vademecum. These documents expand the acts which are considered abusive, clarify the manner in which the cases are processed, and hold people accountable for their action or inaction with regard to processing of a case. Of significant importance is attention given to the care of victim survivors and all who have been harmed. Bishops in the US lead the way for these changes with the implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People 20 years ago. Today every diocese and eparchy must have in place systems for tending to those who have been harmed, protecting those in our care, and seeking restorative justice.

Hearing Assists Available for Use During Mass in The Basilica

St. Fidelis has wireless hearing assists with adjustable volume that connect directly to the church's sound system.

If you are interested in trying one, come by the Parish Office, pay a small deposit, and keep your unit until you don't need it. We will refund your deposit once the unit is returned.

If you already have personal bluetooth hearing aids that are controllable from your cell phone, you can download an app on your cell and hear in church



through your hearing aids. Just download the WaveCAST Audio Receiver app by Williams Sound LLC

from the Apple App Store on i-phones or from Google Play or Play Store on android phones.

While in church when the sound system is turned on, click the WaveCAST icon and select the church's "HearingAid" wi-fi option to connect to the system. The password is also "hearingaid".



You will then control the volume, etc. from your individual hearing aid program already on your phone.




