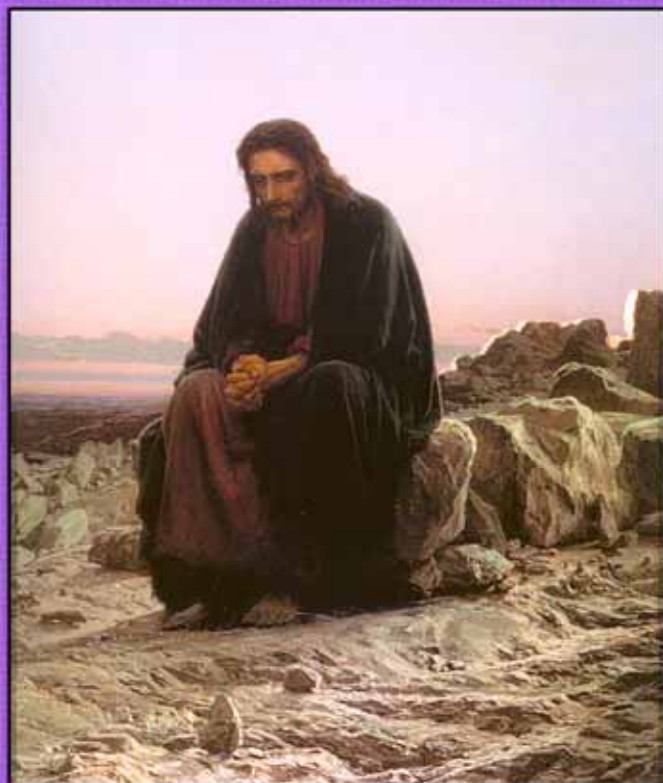

The Devil Made Me Do I

The first Sunday of Lent is always the gospel account of Jesus tempted by the devil. Matthew and Luke give us the story of three temptations. But this year we read from the Gospel of Mark which does not record any particular temptations but says simply, "The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan." (Mk 1:12)

Temptations. We have all experienced them in the urge to do



what we know we should not do. This is often in small matters, as an extra dessert or a tidbit of gossip, but occasionally in serious issues, perhaps theft or lust. St. Paul writes of this disorder in our human nature, "I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate." (Rm 7:15) St. Augustine is usually credited with identifying this innate inclination to do wrong as original sin.

But where does this original sin come from? Why are we so afflicted? From the scriptural account of creation we learn that we inherit the consequences of the fall of Adam, which was a ploy of Satan. So the ultimate cause behind the inclination to do wrong is the work of the devil. Many today question the existence of the devil and his force for evil in the world. But not Pope Francis. He frequently speaks of the devil and his

clever tactics.

"The devil exists, and we must fight against him. We should not think of the devil as a myth, a symbol, or a figure of speech. This mistake would lead us to let down our guard, to grow careless and more vulnerable. The great gossip is the devil who goes around recounting bad things about others, because he is the liar who seeks to divide the church and destroy our community. The devil mixes his own voice with the many other voices



that try to dull our conscience. So never dialogue with the devil."

These cautions of Pope Francis do not suggest failure or doom. St. Paul wrote, "God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your strength; with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it." (1 Cor 10:13) The gospel for this first Sunday of Lent is about the devil tempting Christ and therefore us. But the enduring message is that goodness will triumph over evil.

PASTOR'S CORNER

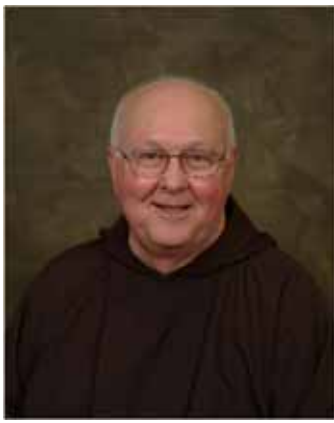
How is the painting project in church coming along?

According to Tim Linenberger, the contractor, we are on schedule to complete the project in the original three months timeframe. I was up to the top of the scaffolding last Friday (February 5). The ceiling is all repaired and painted as well as stenciling done. It looks beautiful. They are well into painting the next level down. In fact, most of all the walls are painted, with stencil work still to be done.

The Pastoral Council has also assessed the need to refinish the church pews and to do something with the floor covering. They are in the process of getting a committee together to consider options, and involving also professional advice. All decisions about what will be done will be made by the Pastoral and Finance Councils. Once this phase is completed, bids for the work will be solicited. The Councils will also select the contractors to do the actual work.

Beside these major projects, the Maintenance Committee has identified an extensive list of items that need attention on the church building and other parish and cemetery properties. Among these, several will require contracted expertise. Only half of the church air-conditioning system had been operating and is in need of repairs. Some of the church windows are in need of repair before there is serious damage. A good number of other needs will be attended to by our own maintenance people and volunteers to the extent that is possible.

We are trying to work together, to be good stewards, and be responsible in taking care of our parish heritage as well as enhance and extend our faith community. God bless you all!

St. Fidelis Ceiling and Painting Update

Since the letter went out, we have received \$7,815 towards the goal of \$145,000. With funds we received earlier for the project, we have a total of \$113,865 towards the cost of \$290,000. We have \$176,135 to go to reach our goal.

Please send or bring your donations to the Parish Office or place them in the collection basket in an envelope marked "**Ceiling and Painting Fund**".

We will also be doing some work to the pews and the floor when the ceiling and painting are finished. Any extra money received from the ceiling project will be used for those projects.

SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION

The dispensation given for all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect until it is safe to lift it. The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation continues because the Church does not want to place a moral burden on those who should not attend Sunday Mass because of age or health conditions.

However, Catholics are still obliged to keep the Commandments, including the Commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day. Families who choose not to attend Mass should conduct a Liturgy of the Word in the home. Individuals and families should spend additional time in prayer, pious devotions, and spiritual reading on Sunday. Younger adults who are least at risk from the virus should take advantage of the opportunity to participate in person at Mass and to receive Holy Communion if they are properly disposed. If those in good health are attending other large social gatherings, they should also be participating at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays.

For those attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, we expect to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks in church.
