“Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.”

**Matthew 22:15-21**



## God and Country

This Sunday we hear a timely gospel as we approach the political elections: "Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar's, and to God what belongs to God.." This verse has been misused by some to justify a total isolation of faith from public life. The meaning of this passage is quite the opposite. The gospel envisions the church and the state as separate, but mutually enriching. Your faith informs your conscience and your conscience cannot be separated from your political convictions and responsibilities.

"Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God." The conjunction "and" is significant; it conveys continuity and unity, not opposition or separation. God and country are not isolated but related, mutually supporting. Giving to God what is God's is a commitment that includes the civic duty of giving to Caesar what is Caesar's. Faith fosters social responsibility.

Some who object to faith animating political activity have been inconsistent. When churches were involved in the civil rights movement, the war on poverty, and opposing military aggression they were applauded. But when churches speak out on life issues, marriage, or immigration their voices are not welcome. One suspects that the agenda, not the principle, is the issue.

People of faith believe that all authority comes ultimately from God. Others may not share that conviction and insist that civil authority is derived solely from the governed. Even so,

they must concede that people of faith are equal members of our nation and in a democracy their voices must also be heard.

The faith commitment of believers does not lessen their civic commitment. It enriches it. Faith instills virtues of justice and truth and mercy, which animate noble political convictions. An authentic democracy will hear not only what Thomas Jefferson, Benjamin Franklin, and Abraham Lincoln can teach us, but also what Jesus of Nazareth, Francis of Assisi, and Theresa of Calcutta can contribute to the public debate.



Our founding fathers recognized this mutual relationship between faith and public life. They rightly objected to an established church, but acknowledged that our Creator is the source of our unalienable rights. Even the inscription on our currency testifies to this tradition, *In God we trust*.

A nation that does not recognize the faith heritage of its people deprives itself of a great resource. If one fails to see the mutually enriching connection between the two parts of this gospel verse — God and Country — one misses its core message. "Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God."

Pope Pius XI instituted World Mission Sunday in 1926, and the first worldwide collection occurred the following year. World Mission Sunday is an effort of the entire Church to help over 1,100 dioceses that cannot sustain themselves because they are too poor, young, or actively persecuted.

Until 1908, the Church in the United States was a mission territory. We relied on this fund to build our churches and seminaries and support our clergy and religious. Today many foreign missions rely on our generosity to sustain the Church, which is an instrument of God's love and mercy, His hope and peace.

# Stewardship for Children Week 3

*“For everything created by God is good, and nothing is to be rejected when received with thanksgiving,” 1 Tim 4:5*

## How do I say “*thank you, God*” for letting me be your steward?

***By taking care of the Gifts He has given me!***

**A Christian Steward is one who receives God’s gifts gratefully, who feels good and shows it by an act.**

**Takes care of these gifts responsibly;** example: we take care of ourselves, our bodies, our minds, etc.

**Shares them lovingly in justice with others;** example: our minds—we learn so that we can teach others.

**Returns them with increase to the Lord;** example: by teaching others so that more people know about Jesus!

Other ways I can learn to show how grateful I am to be God’s Steward

**Prayer** is always number one. This will be my way of talking to God. My prayer includes:

Telling God “thank you” for my life and all the gifts He has given me. Asking God to help me with my needs. Promising God I will always respond to Him. Ending with “*Amen*” tells God I believe Him.

**Bible** — ask my parents to help me read and learn about Jesus. Look for a “Catholic Children’s Bible”

**Church** — remember going to Mass on Sunday for Catholics is following Jesus’ commandment “keep holy the Sabbath Day”
