## Choices, Choices, Choices

There is a subtle message in today's gospel of *the widow's mite* that should not be missed. It is very significant that the widow had two coins. One coin is a simple *yes* or *no*. But two coins create complex options. If she had just one coin, she could simply give it or not give it. But she had two coins and faced more choices. She could keep both. She could give one and keep the other. But she gave both.



Two coins reveal that it was not the total amount that was significant. It was the total giving. The gospel says that in giving both she gave *out of her livelihood*. A way of life, not an isolated gift of charity.

But a caution is in order. This gospel is a parable about total commitment, not titan collections. It is not suggesting that the needy give their necessary resources to church, which Christ condemned as *devouring the savings of widows*. Stewardship is about responsible giving, not irresponsible grabbing. This gospel is about more than donating money. As the two coins illustrate, it is about

discerning priorities, deciding how to live. It is not about finances; it is about faith. It is about almsgiving as *an expression of our faith commitment*.

Many have distorted, even cynical, ideas about giving to charity and to church. Which can be illustrated by a misunderstanding of tithing as *pew rent*. "It costs so much to run this place. I'll pay my fair share." The gospel understanding of tithing says, "I give not that I can have a seat, but that there can be seats for everyone." St. Philip Neri, who cared for orphans, said, "The second coat in your closet does not belong to you. It belongs to the poor child who has none."

This gospel is about more than donating to the temple, it is about a way of life. As the widow with two coins, we have many choices as to how we use our financial resources. An ancient proverb says, "Show me your checkbook and I will tell you what kind of a Christian you are."

If we give as the widow in the gospel, we give because we understand that all we have in life is a gift from God for which we are held accountable. We are stewards, not owners. The poor widow can teach us that. "Amen I say to you, this poor widow gave more than all the others. They contributed from their surplus wealth. But she, from her poverty, her whole livelihood."

“family style” with friends and family at host locations around Hays.

Guests must register at [nex-tech.com/thanksgiving](http://nex-tech.com/thanksgiving) from Monday, November 1, through Monday, November 15. Those not having access to the internet or those requiring meal delivery, may contact First Call for Help at 785-623-2800 for assistance in registering.

**For individual meals:** The registration site will ask for the name, phone number, and email address of every person ordering, as well as the number of meals. Then the guests will select “pick up.” They will drive through to pick up their meals from noon to 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 25, in the parking lot of The Press, 230 E. Eighth, Hays. Please enter from the west. Volunteers will help individuals load their orders.

**For family-style at host locations:** The registration site will ask for the name, phone number, and email address of every person ordering, as well as the number of meals. Then the guests will select a site that can accommodate their group. Then the group just needs to arrive at the time indicated to enjoy a family-style meal in that setting. Please register early for “family style” dining, as the host locations will fill up quickly.

The meal is being catered by “The Press” and will consist of turkey, garlic mashed potatoes, green bean casserole, a roll, and butter. This year, as in years past, the meals are free, offered as a ministry of the Ellis County Ministerial Alliance and with the assistance of generous co-sponsors. Free will donations can be made at the pick-up site and host locations. As in years past, there will be bagged groceries available for individuals who desire them, available in the pick-up line at “The Press.” There is no registration necessary for groceries.
