

Mercy and Repentance

"My heavenly father will treat you in the same way, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart." That is one of the most troubling verses of all scripture. Does our conduct set the standard for God's mercy toward us, or is God's mercy infinite?

The Lord's Prayer echoes the familiar gospel standard of forgiveness which is repeated again in the verse immediately following the prayer: "If you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive

you." (Mt 6:15)

Everyone has

difficulty with forgiveness.

Perhaps it is a friend or a neighbor, a spouse or a

whom we need to forgive or by

child, an in-law

or an outlaw

whom we need to be forgiven. But too often it does not happen. And it is troubling.

This concept of being forgiven according to our own mercy is often misunderstood as though God were a petulant child, "If you are not nice to me, I will not be nice to you." The refusal of forgiveness expressed in this prayer is not that God withholds mercy from the sinner but that a hardened heart is not open to accept forgiveness. An unforgiving heart is so suspicious, vengeful, and untrusting that it cannot accept forgiveness when it is offered. The unforgiving are unforgivable.

As an angry heart punishes itself more than the object of its anger, an unforgiving heart prevents itself from being forgiven. To accept forgiveness in your heart you must have forgiven another from your heart. Only those who love can truly be loved; only those who have suffered can be compassionate; only the generous can appreciate a gift. And only the forgiving can be forgiven. Faithful Christians are to be forgiven forgivers.

Since the mercy of God is infinite some propose a blanket release of all indebtedness without any need of satisfaction. Such cheap mercy, a trivial forgiveness granted to the unrepentant, would damage both justice and mercy. The command of

Christ is to "preach repentance for the forgiveness of sins." (Lk 24:47) The gospel nuance is to offer mercy in such a way as to elicit sincere contrition without imposing a humiliation.

Repentance cannot

be exacted and justice is not vengeance.

The mercy of God is paradoxical. It is infinite, but also limited. It is infinite in God's offering, but limited by our repentance. True forgiveness, that we too often fail to offer or receive, requires a prudent balance of compassion and correction, patience and penance, mercy and morality. "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

St. Fidelis Christian Mothers/Altar Society has been active in our parish since 1887.

Our prayers are joined with prayers of other women throughout the world.

Our primary purpose is to encourage our youth in their faith and to support our parish. We have donated \$1,650 to support religious education and various religious youth programs and over \$750 for maintenance and beautification of the basilica.

We donated \$400 to school programs including the summer lunch program.

We promoted the faith through donations to the Capuchins, Divine Mercy Radio, and Catholic Charities.

To better protect our youth, we, along with the K of C, offered a program on human slavery and sex trafficking.

Since January 1, 2023, we prepared ten funeral dinners to serve 1,295 people. We welcome anyone who wants to help with these dinners either as kitchen help or donating desserts.






