Good Sinners

G. K. Chesterton was once asked, "What's wrong with the world?" He replied, "I am." He was not assuming responsibility for all our social ills. He was simply admitting his own sinfulness with the resolve to do better, despite repeated failures. A repentant sinner is a good sinner. If we give up and lower our ideals the battle is lost.

In this Sunday's gospel the first son said that he would not go, but he did go. The second son said that he would go, but did not. The first was a hypocrite; the second a repentant sinner. Jesus then warned the unrepentant Pharisees, "The tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you." The repentant tax collectors and prostitutes are images of the first son. The chief priest and elders are images of the second.

Those struggling with their sins are closer to God than those who are blind to their sins. The self righteous admit of no fault, insist that they have no sins to confess, and so cannot move closer to God. Only those who acknowledge their failures have a sense of needing the grace of God.

Most of us readily admit that we are sinners. But we are reluctant to specify the sin. We are generic sinners, never guilty of a specific fault. Our confession is generic, "I am a sinner." But sin is a reality that has harsh names like pride, envy, anger, lust, revenge. Only when I can pronounce my own name with such terms – I am envious, I am proud, I am unforgiving – can I move closer to God.

It would be wrong to read today's gospel as soft on sin or condoning evil. The tax collectors and the prostitutes were entering the kingdom of God before the Scribes and the Pharisees not because they were dishonest or promiscuous but because they admitted their wrong and tried to reform their lives, despite repeated failures. They were closer to God not for sinning, but for repenting.

Scripture offers two famous kings to illustrate the message of today's gospel. King David was guilty of adultery with Bathsheba compounded by the murder of Uriah. King Herod was guilty of living with his brother's wife and beheading John the Baptist. Same sins. David is honored as the herald of the Messiah; Herod is despised as a depraved despot. The

difference is not in their sins but in their moral honesty. David repented, Herod did not. Everyone is a sinner. Not everyone is repentant. Be a good sinner, repent!

We wisely speak of a *highway to hell*, but a *staircase to heaven*.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM



DIOCESE OF SALINA

All those who minister to children or young people on a regular basis are to be educated about the nature of child sexual abuse, how to report it, and strategies for prevention.

The Diocese of Salina currently uses a program called CMGCONNECT, a web-based, on-line training program (along with an integrated background check) that specializes in helping churches, schools, and religious organizations create safe environments for children and youth. High School students in grades 9-12 who work with other minors on a regular basis will do their own training through CMGConnect, which covers safe and appropriate ways to interact with other children.

BEFORE beginning any ministry with children in your parish or school, you must have Safe Environment Training and it must be current (taken within the last 5 years).


