## Scripture Fulfilled in Your Heart

"Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." That final verse of today's gospel is the theme for this year's *Sunday of the Word of God*. In 2019 Pope Francis directed that the third Sunday in Ordinary Time be dedicated to honoring the Word of God with prayerful reflection.

Although God speaks to us in many ways — in prayer, through our conscience, and also through other people — the Bible is the privileged communication between God and his people. The biblical stories, parables and prayers have nourished the lives of the people of Israel and the Christian churches through the centuries.

And the scriptures continue to nourish us today. They teach us about God's love and his saving grace in past ages and today. The scriptural texts offer us encouragement, direction, and also a challenge to live as God's children. They are especially valuable to us through the hope they provide in dark moments.

The Bible is far more than human wisdom. It is unique in our communication with God because the Holy Spirit was at work in the formation of the Scriptures. Although many people from different times and places contributed to the actual writing, the Scriptures are divinely inspired. The Bible has fittingly been described as "the Word of God in the words of men."

The Holy Spirit's work did not come to an end with the writing of the

text. That same Spirit, who dwells in us by virtue of our baptism, is also at work within us as we listen to the text. Through the Spirit's inspiration, the words of Scripture become a living Word of the Lord to us here and now.

Our Sunday assembly, gathered as a community of faith to praise God, is the unique moment in the week when we celebrate the Word of God and the Sacrament of the Eucharist to renew our common faith. This mutual relationship of the

Risen Eucharistic Lord, the sacred Scriptures, and the parish community is essential to who we are as Catholics.

In addition to the

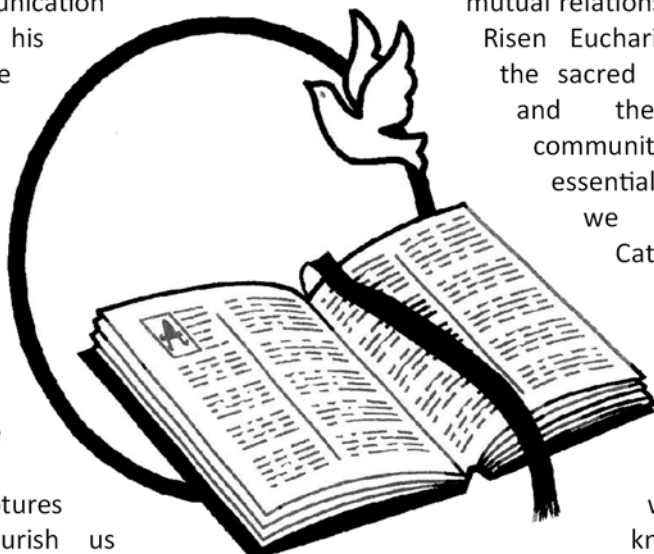
blessings which knowledge

of and reverence for Sacred Scriptures brings to our church and to each of us, they are also a bond with other Christians and the Jewish people who hold the scriptures in high esteem.

On this Sunday of the Word of God we pray that each time we gather to celebrate the liturgy of the Word and Eucharist we may experience that special grace promised in today's gospel, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

## Word of God Sunday at Holy Cross

Everyone is invited to an hour-long celebration entitled "Encounter the Word" on **Sunday, January 23, at Holy Cross Church, Pfeifer, at 2:00 PM.**

There will be music and song, proclamation and still-life dramatization of Scriptures, respective teachings by Father Reggie Urban, a semi-retired priest of the Dodge City Diocese living in Hays, preaching by Sister Francine Schwarzenberger (Order of Preachers) from the Dominican Convent in Great Bend, and witnessing by Michelle Rondeau, a member of Prince of Peace Parish in Great Bend.

Bibles and books about the Bible will be for sale. Bring your Bible to be dedicated. A reception will follow in the grade school next to the church.

This is being done in honor of the Apostolic Letter, "He Opened to Them", by Pope Francis regarding the celebration, study, and distribution of the Scriptures on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time.

2022 tithing envelopes are available at the entrances of all three churches. If you do not have a box of envelopes and would like one please let Jan know at the parish office.

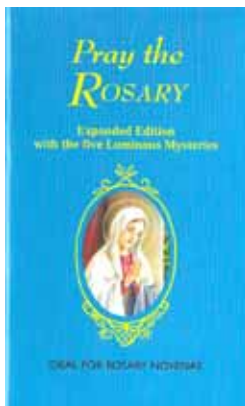

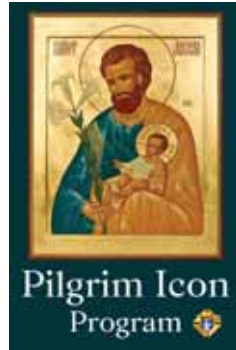


