A Different Kind of King

This final Sunday of the liturgical year, the culmination of all our Sunday celebrations, is the feast of Christ the King. The gospel reading is taken from the trial of Christ before Pilate in the gospel of John.

There is a subtlety in John's account of that trial which should not be missed, especially on this feast of Christ the King. While reading the exchange between Pilate and Christ, as we do every Good Friday, we eventually realize an irony which eluded Pilate: Christ was not on trial before Pilate; Pilate was on trial before Christ!

Their dialogue about Christ being a King reveals this, in a manner so pertinent to this feast. Pilate, concerned about a Jewish revolt against Roman rule, asks Christ, "Are you the king of the Jews?" The response of Christ is cleverly indirect, "My kingdom does not belong to this world." Pilate thinks he now has Christ trapped with self-incrimination on the charge of insurrection and replies, "Then you are a king?" With characteristic subtle wit Christ then lands the haymaker, "You say I am a king." Pilate was the one trapped into admitting a truth, the kingship of Christ, which Pilate then tries to dismiss, "What is truth?"

Every person, often unwittingly, is under the rule of truth, which is the domain of the kingdom of Christ. The preface prayer at Mass today has this description of that kingdom of Christ, "A kingdom of truth and life, a

kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace."

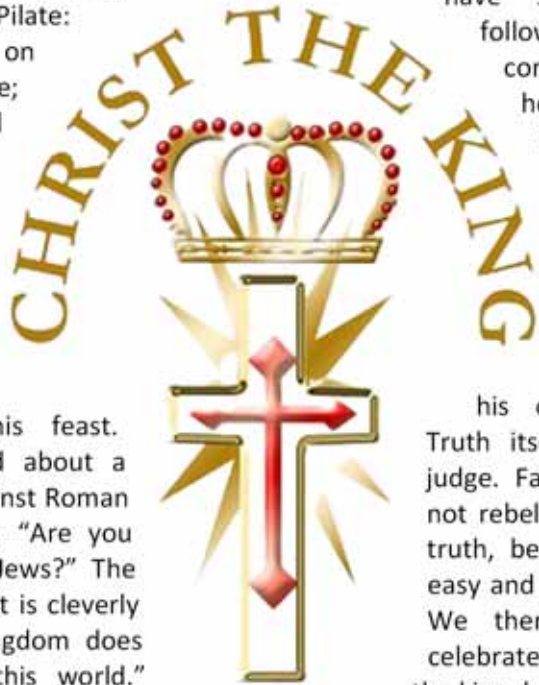
When Christ told Pilate, "My kingdom does not belong to this world," he was not saying that it is unrelated to our daily lives, but that it transcends all earthly kingdoms which are unavoidably subject to his domain of justice, truth, and peace.

Christ is a king beyond Pilate's understanding of earthly rulers, a different kind of king. Christ does not have subjects, he has followers; he does not command, he invites; he does not enforce, he embraces.

Pilate, in a weak self defense, asked cynically, "What is truth?" He was about to learn that from his cowardice to face Truth itself as his ultimate judge. Faithful Christians do not rebel against this rule of truth, because, "My yoke is easy and my burden is light." We therefore rejoice and celebrate this feast of Christ the king, happy to belong to "a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love, and peace."
