The Supper of the Lamb

Before distributing Communion the priest elevates the host and says, "Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." This is an invitation not only to the Eucharistic banquet, but also to the wedding feast of the Lamb in Heaven. The scriptural foundation of the first invitation is from the gospel of John; the second is from the Book of Revelation, also by Saint John.

The Eucharistic reference is derived from John the Baptist's proclamation in today's gospel, "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." This is an analogy with the Exodus of the Hebrews from the slavery in Egypt by the sacrifice of a lamb to our deliverance from the slavery of sin by the sacrificial death of Christ, our Paschal Lamb.

On the night before Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt he told them to sacrifice a lamb for a sacred meal. They were to sprinkle the blood of the lamb on the doorposts so that when the angel of death came that night and killed the first-born of the Egyptians, he would pass over the first-born of the Israelites. (Ex 12:1-13)

This prefigures the redeeming blood of Christ, the Lamb of God, shed on the Cross at Calvary to save us from eternal death. As the Israelites consumed a sacrificed lamb, so we receive in Holy Communion the Body and Blood of Christ at the sacrifice of the Mass, a daily renewal of the sacrifice of Calvary.

The Supper of the Lamb also refers

to the wedding banquet of Heaven. The gospel image of Christ as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world is further developed in the Book of Revelation. That book, also by Saint John, describes the heavenly worship of Jesus as the divine Lamb, and we are promised, "Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb" (Rev 19:9).

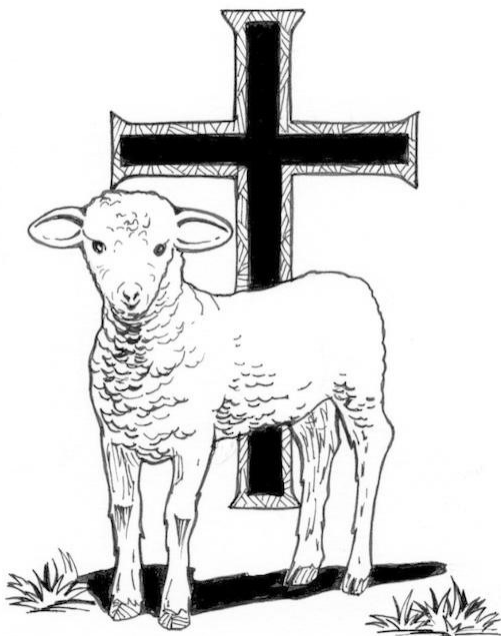
These two celebrations, the Eucharistic meal and the heavenly banquet, are related. Just as the Israelites fed on the manna which fell from Heaven for forty years before they entered the promised land, so the Eucharist is our daily bread which nourishes us on our journey through life to the promise of

the heavenly banquet.

The reception of Holy Communion is both food for the journey, and an invitation to Heaven. Our Lord has promised: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day." (Jn 6:54)

News & Notes from the Diocese Safe Environment Office

One person's stance against child abuse and child sexual abuse has a ripple effect. Other lives are influenced and changed as a result. Each of us can contribute to creating safe environments for all children in our communities. If one person can accomplish so much, imagine what is possible when members of a community work together to protect children. The potential is tremendous!

What Can Parents Do?

- Teach children about healthy and safe relationships.
- Teach children internet safety in a technology-based world. What social media platforms are YOUR children using? Does your child use TikTok?
- Know the warning signs of potential abuse.
- Know about your children's lives. Who do they spend time with? Where do they spend their time?
- Ensure that personnel at your child's school or other adults in their lives are trained in sexual abuse prevention.
- Ensure your child knows what to do in the event of an assault.

What is TikTok?

TikTok is an app that allows users to create and share short videos. TikTok's users enjoy using the app's tools to combine video, music, and graphics into funny sketches and creative shorts.

Why do so many teens like TikTok:

TikTok allows teens to combine music and video to make funny, silly, and clever video shorts. The app and its user community are known to value creativity and authenticity over follower counts and likes. As a result, users find it a refreshing atmosphere where they can be themselves.
