The Mother-in-Law

A mother-in-law is often the butt of unfair jokes, arbitrarily blaming her for a host of family problems. A mother-in-law gets a bum rap in our society. Not in today's gospel. When Christ cured St. Peter's mother-in-law, the gospel tells us that she immediately got up and waited on them. She used the gift of good health to serve others. St. Peter's mother-in-law is a model for using our talents and blessings not simply for our own good, but for the benefit of others as well.

As St. Peter's mother-in-law, we are often in need of a favor from the Lord. And we promise many things if God will but grant us that favor. For example, if God will help me to get a good job, I will be generous to charity. If God will give me back my physical health, I will never miss church. If God will cure my sick child or my sick parent, I will be kinder to them. But once the favor is granted, the promise is easily forgotten. Not St. Peter's

mother-in-law.



She reminds us that the gifts we have received from God are to be used with a generous heart. My health is not just about my own personal well-being. It also concerns the good of my family, my friends, and the wider community. My finances are not just about my own personal good fortune. They are a responsibility regarding others, especially those in need. My education is not simply about advancing my own career. It is about enriching the whole community with my professional training.

At times we save our talents, like fine china waiting for a special occasion. Someday, I will volunteer to help at church or school. Someday, I will join a prayer group. Someday, I will pledge to a charity. But someday seldom comes. Many gifts of time and talent and treasure have been safely stored away in the vaults of apathy never to be used.

The mother-in-law of St. Peter was not the only one in the Bible to be of service to others. There were others, such as Naomi, the mother-in-law of Ruth. Although a poor widow herself, she provided a home for Ruth when she lost her husband. In doing so she secured the lineage of David which brought us the Messiah.

So our mothers-in-law may have the last laugh in all those jokes. Scripture reminds us that there were mothers-in-law who taught us by example this essential duty of a Christian — you truly love your neighbors by helping them.

Since the letter went out, we have received \$7,815 towards the goal of \$145,000. With funds we received earlier for the project, we have a total of \$113,865 towards the cost of \$290,000. We have \$176,135 to go to reach our goal.

We will also be doing some work to the pews and the floor when the ceiling and painting are finished. Any extra money received from the ceiling project will be used for those projects.

SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION

The dispensation given for all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect until it is safe to lift it. The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation continues because the Church does not want to place a moral burden on those who should not attend Sunday Mass because of age or health conditions.

However, Catholics are still obliged to keep the Commandments, including the Commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day. Families who choose not to attend Mass should conduct a Liturgy of the Word in the home. Individuals and families should spend additional time in prayer, pious devotions, and spiritual reading on Sunday. Younger adults who are least at risk from the virus should take advantage of the opportunity to participate in person at Mass and to receive Holy Communion if they are properly disposed. If those in good health are attending other large social gatherings, they should also be participating at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays.

For those attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, we expect to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks in church.

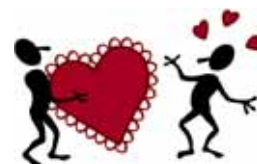

ASH WEDNESDAY—FEBRUARY 17

Lent is a time of grace and renewal for the entire Church, especially for the catechumens and candidates preparing for initiation during the Easter Triduum. The three traditional ascetical practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are important pillars for a faithful experience of Lent.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics (for those age 18 until age 59). In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from eating meat (for those age 14 and over). When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

CHANGES MADE TO THE WAY ASHES WILL BE DISTRIBUTED

During this time of the Coronavirus pandemic, the Holy See has modified the method of distributing ashes. The priest will say the prayer for blessing the ashes. He will sprinkle the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he will address all those present and only once will say the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: "Repent and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return".

The priest will then cleanse his hands, put on a face mask, and distribute the ashes to those who come forward. He will take the ashes and sprinkle them on the head of each person without saying anything.

These changes minimize the necessity of physical contact between minister and recipient and remove the need for the minister to speak while in close proximity to the recipient.

It is good to note that many countries have always sprinkled the ashes in this manner. We might be more in sync with the rest of the Church by doing this. The Old Testament describes various instances where people put on sackcloth and sat in ashes or poured ashes over themselves (see Jonah 3:5; Esther 4:1; Job 2:8 and others).

Throats Blessed


In honor of the feast of St. Blaise (February 3), throats will be blessed after all Masses **this weekend, February 6-7.**

The blessing will be given in a different manner this year due to the pandemic. The priest will give the blessing to all present by extending his hands over the people, without the crossed candles, while saying the prayer of blessing.

2021 Knights of Columbus Free Throw Champions
