Lest We Forget

Today the church celebrates the Ascension of the Lord and tomorrow our nation observes Memorial Day. Both honor the departed by reflecting on the importance of their ultimate sacrifice for others. Lifting our fallen veterans in thought and prayer is an image of the risen Lord ascending to his heavenly Father.

Memorial Day is often considered the beginning of summer, although it is not the actual calendar date. Many celebrate by displaying the flag, attending parades, opening swimming pools, and having backyard barbecues. Adults enjoy a day off from work and the young relish the beginning of vacation from school.

The origin of Memorial Day, once called Decoration Day, is uncertain but most agree that the customs that accompany it date back to the Civil War era when veterans and families decorated the graves of the departed. That patriotic practice gratefully continues.

While Veterans Day honors all the brave women and men who proudly wore the uniform of our armed forces, Memorial Day focuses on those who made the ultimate sacrifice. A very laudable custom is the traditional visit to cemeteries to visit the graves of members of the military who gave their lives for our country. It is entirely fitting that we remember them in prayer, with gratitude and pride.

This year the devastating war in Ukraine casts a somber shadow over our Memorial Day celebration. We are

reminded that the horrors of warfare are not just memories of the past, but a present tragedy. Sadly, we are witnessing a new generation of fallen veterans.

For Christians, the sacrifice of dying for others is the very root of our faith. The crucifix, the central symbol of our religious consciousness, reminds us of how the Lord Jesus redeemed us through his death and freed us from sin. "Greater love than this no one has," our Savior told us, "than to lay down one's life for one's friends (John 15:13)." The sacrifices made by our fallen comrades throughout American history witness to those words of Christ.

No matter how we commemorate Memorial Day, whether with parades and flags or cookouts and summer leisure, the memory of those who have fallen should never be taken for granted or stray far from our consciousness. In a real sense, these heroes in uniform who sacrificed their lives for our freedoms, still give witness to the Lord's words and deeds of service for the love of others. In the shadow of his Cross, may they now behold His face in glory.

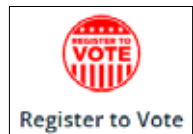
