

Blessed with Happiness

In today's gospel each of the eight beatitudes begins with the word blessed: blessed are the poor in spirit; blessed are the meek; blessed are the peacemakers. The dictionary offers many synonyms for blessed: saintly, holy, blissful, happy. In scripture, Blessed is the divine favor of God's grace by which a holy life is also a happy life.

The gospels teach that the *blessed* of the beatitudes not only means *holy* and *happy*, but that *holy* and *happy* are related. *Blessed* are the merciful; *Holy*



are the merciful; *Happy* are the merciful. *Blessed* are the peacemakers; *Holy* are the peacemakers; *Happy* are the peacemakers. The promise of the beatitudes is that a *holy* person will be blessed as a *happy* person.

Unfortunately, many people today think that holiness precludes enjoying the pleasures of life and therefore happiness. But in truth, holiness is a source of happiness. While *blessed* and *holy* may readily be associated with living the beatitudes, it is *happiness* that is easily overlooked.

Some mistakenly think that religious faith restricts our freedom and therefore limits the joy of life. But history testifies that the great saints were not only holy, but that they were also happy. St. Francis, St. Theresa, and Padre Pio did not find holiness and happiness to be contradictory but

complementary. Few were as happy as they were, because they lived the Beatitudes.

On World Youth Day Pope Francis told young people to "have the courage to be happy" and he offered the beatitudes as a guide on the journey to happiness. This search for happiness, said Pope Francis, is an innate thirst shared by people of all times and all ages. "God has placed in the heart of every man and woman an irrepressible desire for happiness, for fulfillment," he said. "In Christ," he

continued, "you will find your every desire for goodness and happiness fulfilled. He alone can satisfy your deepest longings, which are so often clouded by deceptive worldly promises."

"In a culture of superficial relativism many insist on enjoying only the present moment. They deny the value of making a lifelong commitment. I am asking you to rebel against this culture which preaches that everything is temporary and that you are nable of any serious responsibility.

incapable of any serious responsibility, only the pleasure of the present moment."

The eight beatitudes are the recipe for making a saint, a saint blessed with a life of holiness which knows the happiness of goodness and truth. The popular hymn has it right: "Blessed are you; holy are you; rejoice and be glad. Yours is the kingdom of God."

K. of C. Free Throw Championship






