Gauging Progress

Oct 12, 2025

In today's bulletin you will notice a "thermometer" in the section for our "Stand Strong, Saint Fidelis" project. This will inform us as to the progress of donations.

These days we often see graphs of one kind or another to demonstrate progress or regress of a given activity. Fitness apps show weight loss/gain, steps taken, food consumed, and calories burned. CPAP graphs indicate how well one slept on a particular night. Businesses have charts that show the rise and decline of income.

In our spiritual life, it may seem more difficult to chart the ups and downs, the ebb and flow of our inner spiritual movements day to day and over longer periods of time. I invite us to keep track of these three activities in some way--perhaps with an X on a calendar when we have done them: our daily prayer time, our weekly Sunday Mass, and our weekly Eucharistic Adoration. Rather than try to determine at a given moment, "How is my relationship with God?" which can be more elusive, if we maintain these three activities faithfully over the long haul, our relationship with God will, indeed, improve. These Big Three will form us and shape us more and more into virtuous disciples of Christ. By their very nature, these activities focus us on Christ and His Word and the gift of Himself in the Eucharist. By contrast, a lack of daily prayer, Sunday Mass, and Eucharistic Adoration will mean we are adrift, being tossed about by other activities. Not all of such activities are bad, but they will not keep us close to the heart of Christ.

Please, let us consider our priorities in our schedule of activities and put these three on the top of the list. Let us encourage family and friends to have consistent X's on their calendars for these Big Three.



The exterior of our beloved church is in need of repair. This restoration project will help preserve the structure and beauty of our church for generations to come.



Mid-Continental Restoration Co., Inc. will be completing this work. The scope of the project includes:

Sealant Application to Vertical Joints in Stone Caps & Bands

All vertical head joints between coping stones and stone bands will be cut back and cleaned of any loose or foreign debris. These joints will then be resealed with new sealant, tooled to a neat and uniform appearance, and colormatched as closely as possible to the existing material.

Tuckpointing Stone Mortar Joints

All mortar joints will be carefully inspected. Any that are found to be void, open, or defective will be repaired. All affected areas will be cleaned to remove any loose residue, and defective joints will be repointed using a non-staining, non-shrinking Type "N" masonry mortar. This mortar will be color-matched and tooled to blend seamlessly with the surrounding joints.

The total estimated cost for this vital work is **\$109,980.** We are asking for your generosity in helping us raise the necessary funds to complete these repairs. No amount is too small, and all donations are deeply appreciated. 

CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT WORKING ON THE MARGINS

he Catholic Church has always taught us, through the words of Sacred Scripture and the witness of saints like Francis of Assisi, that the natural world is created by God, that it is good, and that humans have a special duty to care for creation so that it benefits not only themselves but also future generations. Today we live in a time where pollution, climate change, and poor agricultural practices harm creation and place us all in danger.

In 2015, Pope Francis responded to this environmental crisis by issuing the encyclical *Laudato Si'* (On Care for Our Common Home), in which he emphasizes the connection between humanity and nature and calls for "the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development" (no. 13).


This spirit of cooperation, sustainability, and human dignity animates the work of organizations like La Cosecha Community Supported Agriculture, a cooperative farm network in Albuquerque, New Mexico, which makes

locally grown, sustainable, and nutritious foods available to low-income people. With support from the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD), La Cosecha has expanded its outreach beyond Albuquerque to 11 rural New Mexico counties, increased year-round accessibility to healthy produce and other food products, and obtained a US Department of Agriculture Good Agricultural Practices food-safety certification for its cooperative farm partners.

CCHD-funded organizations show how we can care for the environment, address the needs of the poor, and support responsible and sustainable local businesses at the same time. When you participate in the CCHD collection, you help not only other communities but also your own, because 25% of your contribution remains in your diocese to create local solutions to poverty.
