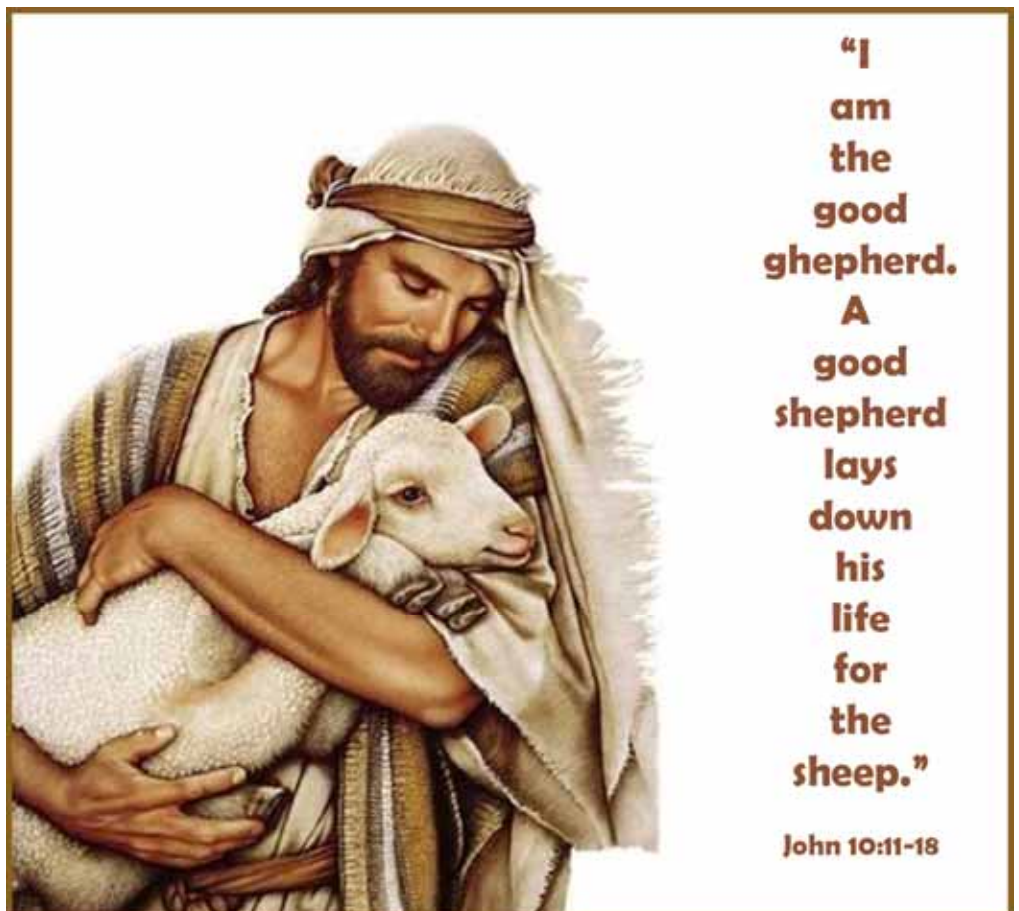

Good Shepherds

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is celebrated as Good Shepherd Sunday. The liturgical cycle of readings offers three different passages from the gospel of John where Christ explains the ways in which he is the shepherd of his followers.

He first describes himself as the gate for the sheep, guarding who enters to protect his flock. He then assures us that he knows the sheep and they know him for he calls each by name as they recognize his voice and follow him. Finally, he reminds us that as the shepherd he will unite a divided flock.

Today's gospel reading is the only biblical passage in which Christ uses the adjective *good* in describing his shepherding. The popular twenty-third Psalm, although known as the Good Shepherd Psalm, does not use the words *Good Shepherd*. Nor do the many other gospel passages that present Christ in the image of a shepherd. But in today's reading Christ says three times, "I am the good shepherd." And that has become the iconic image of Christ as our Savior.

While Christ refers to himself three times in today's gospel as the good shepherd, it is also significant that five times he reminds us that as the shepherd he will lay down his life for his sheep. It is the bond between these images of Christ as the good shepherd and the Paschal Lamb sacrificed for

others that we celebrate during the Easter season.

The shepherd offering his life for his sheep is found in various settings in the gospels. During the last Supper, for example, Christ reminded his apostle of the prophecy regarding his approaching hour of death and their abandoning him at that crucial time, "I will strike the shepherd and the sheep will be dispersed." (Mk 14:27 citing Zec 13:7) Later when Christ commissioned St. Peter to be the shepherd of the church he reminded him of the martyr's death that office would bring upon him. (Jn 21:19)



While these scriptures tell us that Christ and many of the Apostles have given their lives as shepherds of the faithful, they also remind us that all service of the faith requires sacrifice, at times even heroic. If you are the shepherd or shepherdess of your family, your students, your business, etc. it will entail hardships as well as rewards. As faithful followers of Christ the Good Shepherd, we are called to be good shepherds who offer tiring service graciously. "A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." (Jn 10:11)

... and mirth

It is the duty of a good shepherd to shear his sheep, not to skin them.

Her eyes slowly opened and her expressions suddenly changed. "I meant my dress size, you idiot!!!"

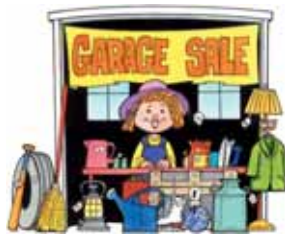
