

## The Light that Came into the World

By a happy coincidence this fourth Sunday of Lent falls on the Sunday we begin daylight savings time. Today's gospel features, "The light that came into the world." This Sunday is also known as *Laetare Sunday*, meaning a day to rejoice, a pause in the rigors of the Lenten season. Lent Lite.

One of the basic themes of the gospel of John is the contrast between light and darkness, where light is symbolic of living in the presence of

So Nicodemus came at night. He was open to the truth but was still in doubt. Christ explained to him that we can live in the light of God's truth because, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (Jn 3:16) That verse is one of the most quoted passages in the New Testament; it is the gospel in miniature, a summary of John's theology.

It is also prime evidence that God loves us not merely in words but in deeds. He sent his only Son to share in our human life that we might share in his divine life. But faith is a prerequisite to receiving that grace. As John wrote, "Whoever believes in him will not be condemned."


Christ then continues with this sober contrast between light and darkness, "The light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light." Why? "Everyone who does wicked things hates the light and avoids it so that his works might not be exposed." But the message ends on a hopeful note, "Whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his words may be clearly seen as done by God."

Perhaps the added hours of daylight in this coming season will remind us of *the light that came into the world* that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.

God and darkness is the absence of that grace of enlightenment. And today's gospel of the dialogue of Christ with Nicodemus offers a clear example of this theme.

The introduction to this gospel passage tells us that Nicodemus, a well meaning Pharisee curious about the teachings of Jesus, came to him privately at night. In John's gospel night means more than the time of day. It is the absence of the light of divine grace which can lead to confusion, doubt, even despair. When Judas left the last Supper to betray Christ, John's gospel says, "And it was night."

## SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION

The dispensation given for all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect until it is safe to lift it. The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation continues because the Church does not want to place a moral burden on those who should not attend Sunday Mass because of age or health conditions.

**However, Catholics are still obliged to keep the Commandments, including the Commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day.** Families who choose not to attend Mass should conduct a Liturgy of the Word in the home. Individuals and families should spend additional time in prayer, pious devotions, and spiritual reading on Sunday. Younger adults who are least at risk from the virus should take advantage of the opportunity to participate in person at Mass and to receive Holy Communion if they are properly disposed. If those in good health are attending other large social gatherings, they should also be participating at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays.

***For those attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, we expect to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks in church.***
