

Branches of the Vine

that are so parables The characteristic of the teachings of Christ are not found in the gospel of John. Instead, John's gospel uses two metaphors: the good shepherd and the branches of the vine. Today's gospel reading offers the image of the vine and branches to teach this basic message of Christ: we can share in the life of God through the mystery of grace when we remain united to Christ.



This image of the branches of the vine was understood well by the audience of Christ who were familiar with the cultivation of vineyards. Although many today have never seen a vineyard, we do care for plants and gardens and can readily appreciate the message. The branches share in the life of the vine and lose that life when separated from it.

"I am the true vine and my Father is the vine grower." "I am the vine, you are the branches." The first verse assures us that Christ shares the divine life of God the Father; the second builds on the first to explain that through Christ we can also be part of the life which He shares with his Father. The theological term for this mystery of faith is grace.

The Catholic Catechism explains: "Sanctifying grace introduces us into

the inner life of the Trinity. This gratuitous gift from God is infused by the Holy Spirit into our soul to heal it of sin and sanctify it. This grace responds to our deepest yearning, as it calls us to enrich our human existence with divine life. Grace requires our cooperation to be fruitful; it must be freely received."

Sanctifying grace should not be misunderstood as our becoming divine beings. We are not divinized, but we are aided by the merits of Christ to live an elevated human life. Grace is derived from the Incarnation.

when Jesus of Nazareth was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and assumed our human nature. He was and remained a divine person, but took on our human nature in time. This event has transformed humanity. Since God was once man, humanity is forever changed, invited to share in the very life of God.

This gift of grace from God to share in divine life

is one of the great treasures of our Christian faith. When Joan of Arc was asked by her critics if she was living in God's grace she replied, "If I am not, may it please God to put me in it; if I am, may it please God to keep me there. I desire nothing more." Amazing grace!

Did you know... What is happening in the diocese to protect children?

- Training is provided for all adults and youth to identify warning signs and develop strategies for maintaining a safe environment for all.
- A designated Victim Assistance Coordinator is available to receive reports and accompany victims through their journey.
- A volunteer independent Review Board assists the bishop in the review of cases and makes recommendation for moving forward.
- A Safe Environment Coordinator assists parish and school personnel with training and background screenings for anyone who may have access to children.
- An audit is conducted by an independent firm to evaluate implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. Findings are incorporated with those of other dioceses and made available in an Annual Report.
