

#### ASH WEDNESDAY—FEBRUARY 22

Lent is a time of grace and renewal for the entire Church, especially for the catechumens and candidates preparing for initiation during the Easter Triduum. The three traditional ascetical practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are important pillars for a faithful experience of Lent.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics (for those age 18 until age 59). In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from eating meat (for those age 14 and over). When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

#### The Paradox of Ashes

This Wednesday every Catholic church in the world will be crowded. It is not a Holy Day nor a holiday. It is a work day in the middle of the week with busy schedules and little time for leisure. There is no social or parish pressure to attend church on Ash Wednesday. Yet there are crowds, big crowds

The message on Ash Wednesday is not pleasant. You are not assured that you are a good Christian. On the contrary, you are told that you are a

sinner who needs to repent, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the gospel." You are reminded in blunt terms of your mortality,

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you will return." You are told that you need to pray, fast, and give alms. Yet on Ash Wednesday people flock to

church and listen attentively to these unpleasant truths.

On Ash Wednesday you are reminded not only that you are a sinner but that you will die and face God in judgment. No alleluias on Ash Wednesday. The Scripture readings are not about love and joy, but about sin and death. Your appearance, which you carefully preened earlier in the day, will be ruined with a smudge of ashes.

Catholics will return to their workplace and social circle with this stigma of ashes. A stigma respected, perhaps grudgingly, by those of other faiths or no faith. It says in the power unique to symbols, "We mean business." Catholicism is a nononsense faith. We will not compromise the practice of our faith to accommodate popular culture. We are marked as different which may raise awkward questions from curious unbelievers. This is not the way to enhance your social status.

On Ash Wednesday we wrestle with the unpleasant truth that we are all sinners in need of repentance and forgiveness. We admit that we cannot do it ourselves. We need redemption. We need God's grace. So we come to

> church for this ancient ceremony asking for a new grace to live a new and better life.

Ash Wednesday is about a human truth, а spiritual truth, an eternal truth. It is about frail human our propensity to sin. It is about our responsibility to live honorably before

God and our neighbor. It is about the eternal consequences of our earthly life. These are the essential truths of life and faith. That is why there will be crowds, big crowds.



#### U.S. Bishops' International Justice and Peace Chairman Calls for Prayer in the Wake of Earthquake in Turkey and Syria; Calls for Assistance

#### February 8, 2023

WASHINGTON - The February 6 earthquake that struck Turkey and Syria has caused the deaths of thousands and injured many more. Bishop David J. Malloy of Rockford, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on International Justice and Peace, mourned the loss of so many lives, called for the faithful to pray for those impacted, and give generously to those in need.

"The strong earthquake that rocked southeastern Turkey and northern Syria on February 6 has caused the deaths of over 11,000 people and injured thousands more. As the death toll continues to rise, rescue workers are still trying to free people from rubble and those alive are facing freezing conditions as they try to salvage their belongings and seek shelter.

"I join with our Holy Father Pope Francis in praying for the souls of the departed as we mourn the loss of so many lives. We pray for those injured and the many others suffering, and we also pray for the safety and protection of emergency personnel working to save lives and tending to those in need in the wake of this disaster.

"In a region that has experienced much conflict and hardship, these heartbreaking scenes call out to us to provide aid and assistance to our brothers and sisters in need. I call upon the faithful to give generously to <u>Catholic Relief Services</u> and the <u>Catholic Near East</u> <u>Welfare Association</u> who are working to provide emergency humanitarian relief. I also call upon the U.S. government to provide much needed assistance and to work in conjunction with Catholic aid organizations to deliver effective assistance to those most in need."



If you are willing to help, please call the Parish Office at 785-735-2777. We can provide you with a history book to get you started.


