

Quick question: What is the "mother church" for Roman Catholics? Most people think it's St. Peter's Basilica at the Vatican, but that is incorrect. Yes, St. Peter's is where all the high-profile events of the Catholic Church take place: the announcement and blessing of the new pope; the general papal audiences; the canonization of new saints; and the annual Christmas Midnight Mass with the Holy Father, seen by a worldwide audience. These are significant events, but if St. Peter's is not the mother church of the Catholic faith, what is?

The answer is: the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome. The basilica is named after St. John the Baptist, and after the Lateranus family, on whose property the great church was built. St. John Lateran is the earliest basilica of Christianity.

Why does the whole Church celebrate the dedication of this Roman archbasilica today? First, keep in mind that many parishes, including cathedrals, celebrate the anniversary of their dedication. You can think of that Dedication Day as a local feast day for the parish. Since St. John Lateran is the mother church for all of Catholicism, in a very real sense today, November 9, is a "local" feast day for the whole Church.

IMMIGRATION

Immigration issues often evoke strong emotional responses-understandably. There are important values at stake. In 2005, the Catholic bishops of the United States and of Mexico wrote a pastoral letter called Strangers No Longer: Together on the Journey of Hope. They called for a comprehensive approach to reform immigration policy. Sadly, that is still the case now, twenty years later. As Catholic Christians, we need to consider the secular laws and policies in the context of Scripture and Catholic Social Teaching. We want a system that is just and also humane. The bishops' call for reform includes these elements:

Global anti-poverty efforts. "Many migrants are compelled to leave their homes out of economic necessity in order to provide even the most basic of needs for themselves and their families. Trade, international economic aid, debt relief, and other types of economic policies should be pursued that result in people not having to migrate in desperation in order to survive."

Expanded opportunities to reunify families. "United States citizens and legal permanent residents must endure many years of separation from close family members who they want to join them in the United States. The bishops call for a reduction of the pending backlog and more visas available for family reunification purposes."

Temporary worker program. "The United States economy depends upon the labor provided by migrants. The bishops call for a more rational and humane system by which laborers from other countries can enter the country legally to fill positions in the labor force, including on a temporary basis. Because the United States experience with temporary workers programs has been fraught with abuses, the bishops call for a temporary worker program that includes:

- ---Path to permanent residency which is achievable/verifiable:
- ---Labor protections and enforcement mechanisms to enforce worker's rights;
- ---Wages and benefits which do not undercut domestic workers;
- ---Mobility between the United States and homeland and within the United States:
- ---Labor-market test to ensure United States workers are not harmed.

Broad-based legalization. "For those in this country without proper immigration documentation, opportunities should be provided for them to obtain legalization if they can demonstrate good moral character and have built up equities in this country. Such an 'earned' legalization should be achievable and independently verifiable."

Restoration of due process. "In recent years, immigrants have been subject to laws and policies that debase our country's fundamental commitment to individual liberties and due process. We are a nation with a long, rich tradition of welcoming newcomers. Government policies that unfairly and inappropriately confuse immigration with terrorism do not make us safer, tarnish our heritage, and damage our standing abroad.

The exterior of our beloved church is in need of repair. This restoration project will help preserve the structure and beauty of our church for generations to come.



Mid-Continental Restoration Co., Inc. will be completing this work. The scope of the project includes:

Sealant Application to Vertical Joints in Stone Caps & Bands

All vertical head joints between coping stones and stone bands will be cut back and cleaned of any loose or foreign debris. These joints will then be resealed with new sealant, tooled to a neat and uniform appearance, and colormatched as closely as possible to the existing material.

Tuckpointing Stone Mortar Joints

All mortar joints will be carefully inspected. Any that are found to be void, open, or defective will be repaired. All affected areas will be cleaned to remove any loose residue, and defective joints will be repointed using a non-staining, non-shrinking Type "N" masonry mortar. This mortar will be color-matched and tooled to blend seamlessly with the surrounding joints.

The total estimated cost for this vital work is \$109,980. We are asking for your generosity in helping us raise the necessary funds to complete these repairs. 




