## Happy New Year

The above is not a misprint. Today, the first Sunday of Advent, begins a new liturgical year. This year we will read from the gospel of Luke (C); last year (B) was Mark, and next year (A) will be Matthew.

We are all eager to celebrate the wonderful season of Christmas and are tempted to rush the season, spiritually as well as materially. But first we need to place Christmas in the proper context by reflecting on today's readings about the second coming of Christ at the end of time, the Parousia. How will that help?



Advent is not an extended Christmas eve, but a time to prepare for the many ways that Christ comes to us. There are three major comings of Christ in salvation history: his birth on the first Christmas, his coming into our lives each day, and his final coming at the fulfillment of time. These are best understood in the reverse order. So we begin Advent with readings about his coming at the end of time when salvation history will be completed. This enables us to understand better the meaning of his birth in Bethlehem and his daily rebirth in our hearts.

Today's gospel describes that end

of the world in figurative language, "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars; the powers of heaven will be shaken." At the end of the liturgical year, we read a gospel description of the end of the world. But today the gospel does not stress an ending but a beginning. "When these signs appear, raise your heads because your redemption is at hand." Something new is coming.

The Second Vatican Council spoke of the end of the world and the final coming of Christ. "We do not know the time of the end of the earth and of humanity. Nor do we know how all things will be transformed. The shape of this world, now deformed by sin, will pass away. And God is preparing a new dwelling where justice will abide. Meanwhile during the time that is left,

we are to nurture human dignity, freedom, peace, and all that is good in this life, for we will find them again, but free of stain, and transfigured." (GS 39)

Advent is a time to prepare our hearts for the many ways that Christ comes to us: his historic birth at Bethlehem, his coming into our hearts each

Christmas, and his final coming at the end of time — which will truly be a Happy New Year.

### ... and mirth

In five billion years the sun will expand, engulf our orbit, and vaporize the earth. Have a nice day.
