## The End of the World Will Not Be the End of the World

Today's gospel is a form of biblical literature known as apocalyptic literature which presents the struggle between good and evil with symbols. It often focuses on the ultimate battle at the end of time. Each of the four gospels has an apocalyptic description of the end of the world which we read at the end of the liturgical year with this paradoxical message: the end of the world will not be the end of the world.

The end of the world has multiple meanings: the collapse of the cosmic universe; the moment of each individual's death; and those tragic moments when our lives become

unraveled. For each of these the gospel reminds us that the end of the world will not be the end of the world.

Apocalyptic scripture is not a literal description of the end of time, but an allegorical message of hope and courage in our present struggles. These passages were written during the persecution of the early Christians in a coded language of faith, clear to the faithful but senseless babbling to their persecutors. They were written to assure oppressed Christians that the present persecution was neither the

end of the church nor of their world.

The Second Vatican Council said of the end of the world: "We do not know the time of the end of the earth and of humanity. Nor do we know how all things will be transformed. The shape of this world, now deformed by sin, will pass away. And God is preparing a new dwelling where justice will abide. Meanwhile during the time that is left,

we are to nurture human dignity, freedom, peace, and all that is good in this life, for we will find them again, but free of stain, and transfigured." (GS

39)

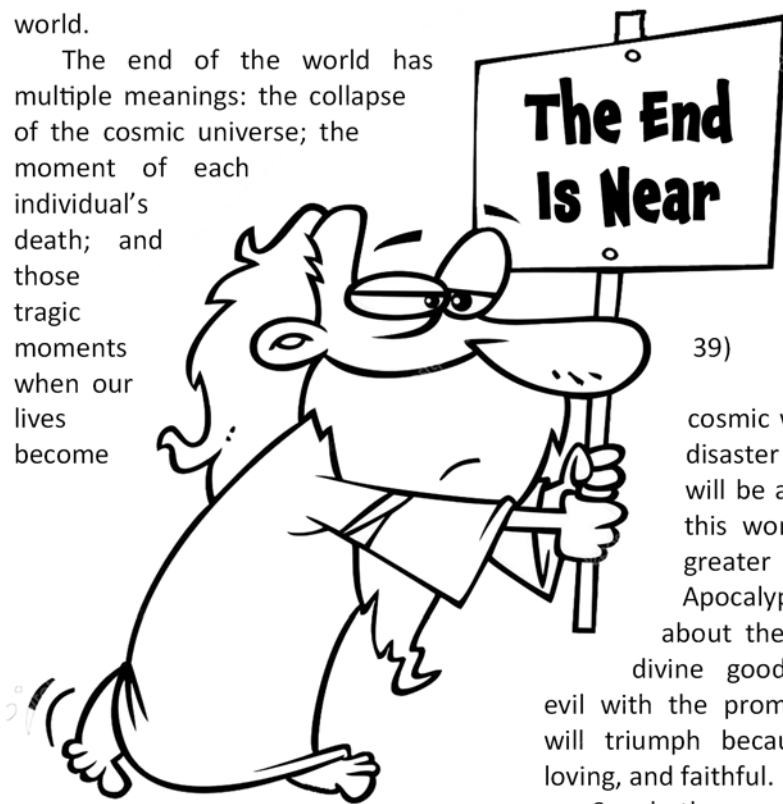
The end of the cosmic world will not be a disaster but a fulfillment. It will be a transformation of this world into something greater and better. Apocalyptic scripture is about the struggle between

divine goodness and satanic evil with the promise that goodness will triumph because God is good, loving, and faithful.

So whether your present anxiety is the collapse of the cosmic world, or our cultural world or your personal world, the gospel assures us that divine goodness will triumph over all evil. Every cosmic ending will be the beginning of something better. The end of the world will not be the end of the world.

Guests may choose either individually packaged meals for drive-through pick-up or they may choose to dine “family style” with friends and family at host locations around Hays.

**For individual meals:** The registration site will ask for the name, phone number, and email address of every person ordering, as well as the number of meals. Then the guests will select “pick up.” They will drive through to pick up their meals from noon to 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 25, in the parking lot of The Press, 230 E. Eighth, Hays. Please enter from the west. Volunteers will help individuals load their orders.

**For family-style at host locations:** The registration site will ask for the name, phone

Then the group just needs to arrive at the time indicated to enjoy a family-style meal in that setting. Please register early for “family style” dining, as the host locations will fill up quickly.

The meal is being catered by “The Press” and will consist of turkey, garlic mashed potatoes, green bean casserole, a roll, and butter. This year, as in years past, the meals are free, offered as a ministry of the Ellis County Ministerial Alliance and with the assistance of generous co-sponsors.
