Cattle Are Driven; Sheep Follow

Today, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. The popular *Good Shepherd Psalm 23* does not actually use the term Good Shepherd. Christ refers to himself as the Good Shepherd only in John's gospel (Jn 10:14). Each year the gospel for this Fourth Sunday of Easter is a passage from the tenth chapter of John's gospel.

In that chapter of John's gospel Jesus describes the noble qualities of a dedicated shepherd. The most comforting is the Good Shepherd seeking out the lost sheep. In today's gospel Christ calls himself the gate for the sheep, the guardian protecting his sheep from thieves. In other passages the shepherd unites a divided flock, calls his sheep by name as they know his voice and follow him. Christ repeats five times that he is the shepherd who will lay down his life for his sheep.

Most of us have never seen a shepherd tending a flock of sheep, but



cattlemen from western movies. If we transfer our idea of a cattleman onto a shepherd we will miss the gospel message of Christ as our shepherd. Cattlemen and shepherds are both stockmen yet there is a major difference in the way they work. A cattleman drives his herd. A shepherd leads his flock. Cattle are driven; sheep follow.

Christ is the Good Shepherd and

we are his sheep. Christianity is not a

cattle drive. It is a pasture under the care of a shepherd who leads his flock. This image captures the essential nature of our faith.

unbelievers often misunderstand. The Good Shepherd does not have a herd, he has a flock; he does not compel, he invites; he does not enforce, he embraces. The Christian faith is not a tyranny, as critics suggest. It is a kingdom of truth and life, of holiness and grace, justice, of love and peace. Such values do not rule by force but by faith.

Sheep need a shepherd. Sheep are easily distracted, carelessly wander into danger, often get lost, and need to be led to food and water. Such an image of faithful Christians may seem unflattering. Yet, in the spiritual realm, we often resemble such sheep.

We easily wander from truth and goodness; we get lost; we need spiritual direction and nourishment. That message is relevant also to a secular world which often rebels against the shepherd it needs. Today we gratefully celebrate the care of our Good Shepherd. We are his faithful flock. We are not driven. We follow.




