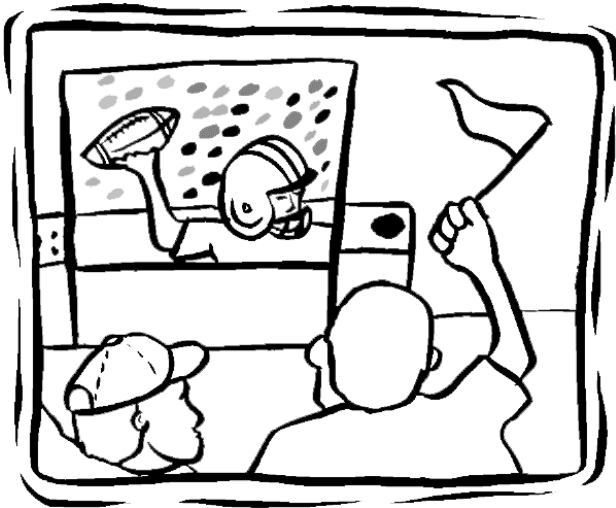
Luke 6:17, 20-26



Super Sunday

Unless you are living on Mars you know that today is Super Bowl Sunday. And unless you are a stranger to the Sunflower State you are sadly aware that the Kansas City Chiefs are not in this Super Bowl.

However, today is about more than the football game. It is an unofficial holiday to recover from the January blahs with Super Bowl parties and festivities to warm the winter chill. With all this celebration we should not miss today's gospel which has a fitting reflection for the occasion. It is about joy and sorrow, laughing and weeping. In sum, winners and losers.



This gospel is Luke's version of the well known Eight Beatitudes in Matthew's gospel. It is less known but equally worthy of serious reflection. While Matthew offers eight blessings, Luke takes what some consider a more realistic approach with four blessings and four woes. He expresses both the positive and the negative dimensions of our Christian life.

Notice the balance that Luke offers in contrast to Matthew's version. Matthew: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Luke agrees: "Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours." But then Luke balances this

message: "But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation."

Again, Matthew says "Blessed are you who hunger and thirst for righteousness for you will be satisfied." Luke has a similar verse but he then adds: "Woe to you who are filled now, for you will be hungry."

Despite this contrast, both offer the same positive summary: Matthew; "Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Luke: "Blessed are you when people hate you on account of the Son of Man, for your reward will be great in heaven."

In life we enjoy many blessings, which we should celebrate. But we also encounter many difficulties, which we need to abide peacefully. We know both the blessings and the woes of today's gospel and also the hope of final vindication.

This message resonates also with today's Super Bowl. There must be a loser as well as a winner. Regardless of which team we are rooting for, today's gospel reminds us to recognize the achievements of the loser as well as the champion.

Today's gospel cautions us: "Woe to you who laugh now, for you will grieve and weep." "Blessed are you who are now weeping, for you will laugh." Have a Super Sunday!

The Worldwide Synod — March Meeting at St. Nick's in Hays

The first phase of the two-year synod called by Pope Francis is happening in local dioceses throughout the world. The goal of the synod is to become a more “listening” Church. A listening session will be held in **Hays at St. Nicholas Parish Pall on Sunday, March 20, at 3:00 p.m.** Anyone is invited to participate.

The entire Catholic Church is called to participate in the upcoming Synod of Bishops. This synod is entitled: “For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission.” Pope Francis has called the entire People of God to journey together. This synod is not just another meeting with oral presentati

ons and written reports. This synod is a process of journeying together by listening, dialoguing, praying, discerning, and making decisions together for the purpose of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Pope Francis is asking each local diocese to gather—clergy, religious, and laity together—to listen to each other. The goal of this journeying together is not to create a new vision or pastoral plan with objectives. Rather, the goal of our journeying together is to be present with one another, to listen and learn with each other, and to grow closer to the Lord and His Church.

“This synod offers us the opportunity to be with each other, to invite our family and friends back to the faith, to listen to each other’s joys and sorrows, and share our hope and dreams for our parishes.” ~Cardinal Wilton Gregory

Synod is a Greek word; *synodos* means a meeting or assembly. The two Greek words that make up synod are *syn*, meaning together, and *hodos*, meaning way or journey.

Vatican II pointed out that the Church is not the Kingdom but it is the People of God accompanying one another on the pilgrimage to the Kingdom. Synodality is a periodic assessment, not of the progress toward the Kingdom, but of our accompanying one another.

Synod listening sessions will be held in seven locations within the diocese: Manhattan, Salina, Hays, Colby, Norton, Tipton, and Belleville.

The questions for discussion will be the following.

1. What brings you joy in your local parish or in the larger Church right now?
2. What brings you sadness about the Church?
3. Where do you see the Spirit leading the Church?

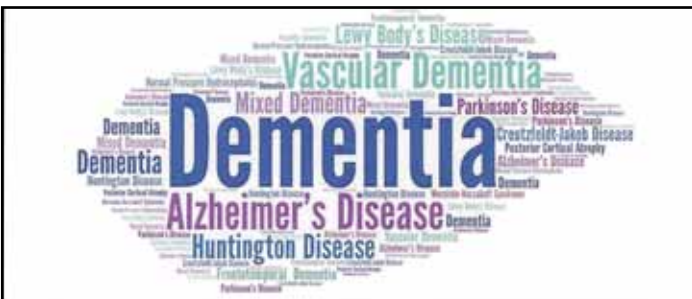
