

Amazing Grace



Here is an amazing story. In 1786 a 16-year-old boy named John Newton joined the navy and soon adopted the decadent life of a drunken sailor. One day a fierce storm erupted, threatening to capsize the ship. John overheard the captain tell the first mate that the ship and the crew would surely be lost. A terrorized young John Newton fell to his knees and he prayed, "Lord, spare the life of this wretched sinner and I will repent."

Amazingly, the storm calmed and the crew was rescued. The rest of John Newton's amazing story later, but first consider how young John Newton, the dissolute sailor, is an image of Bartimaeus, the blind man in the gospel who begged Christ to let him see. The gospel says, "He received his sight, and started to follow him on the way." He followed Him on His way of life, he followed his teachings on the way of a new spiritual journey.

So there are actually two miracles in this gospel story. The blind man was given physical sight; he was also given the sight of faith. As Bartimaeus, the spiritually blind John Newton asked for a special favor from God. When the blind man asked to be cured of physical blindness he was also offered

spiritual sight. The spiritually blind John Newton was also offered a vision of faith.

This gospel story is about more than Bartimaeus and John Newton. It is about us. We often want a favor from God, and we promise many things if only God will grant us that favor. But when the favor is granted, the promise is easily forgotten. A disaster can awaken our faith, but only if the inviting grace is answered.

As Paul Harvey would say, "now the rest of the *amazing* story" about John Newton who promised

that he would repent if God would spare his life. Amazingly, John Newton did reform his life. He became a devout Christian. He studied the scriptures and composed many religious hymns. Actually, you have heard the amazing story of John Newton many times because many times you have heard the hymn which he wrote to commemorate his conversion during that storm. John Newton, the repentant seaman, wrote these familiar lyrics.

"Amazing grace, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me I once was lost, but now am found; was blind, but now I see."

... and mirth



Religious Education Families All Souls Rosary

O good Jesus, have mercy on our loved ones and grant unto them eternal rest

Wednesday October 30, 2024 6:30 -7:30 P.M.

Parents and students, please gather in Victoria Elementary School's cafeteria † by 6:30 P.M. *Wear a white or neon shirt if you have one. :)*. All other parishioners, family, and friends are welcome to accompany us at the rosary at 7:00 P.M. See below for more information regarding this beautiful tradition in our Catholic Faith.



What is the All Souls Rosary? This rosary is said on standard rosary beads. On each bead the specific prayer "O good Jesus, have mercy on (insert your deceased loved ones name) and grant unto them eternal rest" is recited. The All Souls Rosary includes specific intentions for those who have died and for their souls to rest eternally in Heaven.

What is a Living Rosary? A living rosary is one that the students and families will participate in. Each child/teen will have their turn to say a prayer for their deceased loved one and mention his/her name aloud (For example: O good Jesus, have mercy on (insert loved ones name or multiple names) and grant unto them eternal rest." Each child/teen will be given a glowstick to break when their prayer is said aloud. By the end of the living rosary, all of the glow sticks will be lit—lighting up the church. All are invited to wear neon colored shirts and clothing.

What to expect? All families will gather in Victoria Elementary School's cafeteria at 6:30 P.M. Each family will be given a glowstick and two stickers. Each family will write down the individual(s) name(s) they will mention and pray for during the rosary. One sticker will then be placed on the glowstick. Each family will also be given a copy of the short prayer which their child/teen will read aloud in the church, or a parent may wish to read aloud if their child is too young to read. Shortly before 7:00 P.M. we will move to the church for the rosary. At 7:00 P.M. the church bells will toll inviting all in the community to accompany us in this rosary and prayers for our deceased loved ones. The rosary will conclude at 7:30 P.M. following a photo of the Living Rosary in the church.
