

Eucharist Adoration Opportunities

We are more and more accustomed nowadays to Eucharistic Adoration with the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance on the altar. This is a great opportunity because it can last and in him, O God, almighty Father, in for an hour or more which gives us time to worship Christ and pray with the Blessed Sacrament in sight. When a monstrance is not available, it is permissible to place a ciborium (metal dish with a lid) on the altar. In this case we know the Blessed Sacrament is therein even though we cannot see Him. Since most every church and chapel has a monstrance, this method of Adoration is not common. And, of

anytime we enter a Catholic church or chapel we are gratefully aware of the Real Presence of Christ in the tabernacle.

course,

Let us

also be aware and reverent at some other adoration opportunities during the Mass. These moments are brief, but can still be profound. During the Consecration within the Eucharistic Prayer, the priest silently raises the newly consecrated Body of Christ for a moment for all to see. Then the priest also silently raises the chalice holding the Blood of Christ for a moment for all to see. These elevations allow us to worship Christ newly present upon the altar. We acknowledge him as our Lord and God.

Then, later in the Mass, during the Doxology at the end of the Eucharistic

Prayer, the priest lifts up the chalice and paten (dish), or the chalice with the large Host over it. The priest sings or says, "Through him, and with him, the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever." All respond, "Amen", acknowledging Christ's presence.

Then, before the distribution of Communion, the priest holds up the Body of Christ and says, "Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." All respond, "Lord, I am not

> worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." Here, together, we speak directly to our Eucharistic Lord Himself.

Finally, as we receive Holy Communion, the Body of Christ is shown to us and we hear, "The Body of Christ", and we respond, "Amen". The chalice is shown to us and we hear, "The Blood of Christ", and we respond, "Amen". May our "Amen" always be clear and heart-felt.

The pandemic had hit Christians in the Holy Land particularly hard. Most of them depend on pilgrimages for work. The war made their situation even more dramatic. In these times of crisis, the Pontifical Good Friday collection is necessary to meet the basic needs of the People of God still living in this Land and to maintain a Christian presence where the Church was born.

When you contribute to the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, you join with Catholics around the world in solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land.

What has been accomplished? Last year's Pontifical Good Friday Collection 1) supported 23 parishes and three academic institutions; 2) provided a home in Bethlehem for 30 children from homes facing domestic violence; 3) offered more than 500 scholarships for university education; 4) helped keep schools open for over 10,000 pre-K though grade 12 students; 5) supported 53 friars preparing for the priesthood; 6) restored and maintained 640 houses/apartments for Christian families; 7) provided assistance to more than 9,000 families through weekly food baskets; 8) employed more than 1,000 workers in the Holy Land; 9) preserved 80 shrines from the life of Jesus, the Apostles, and the prophets; 10) continued the work of restoring the floor at the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher, the holiest place on Earth.

The parish hall is being renovated and is in its latter phase. There will be air conditioning installed in the near future (no specific date as of now). The parish council of St. Ann's will decide on prices of rental and develop rules for its use (such as no taping on walls, etc.). We will most likely hire people to clean the hall after it is used if those renting do not want to clean it. If you are interested in doing this, let one of the parish council members know. There have been a couple volunteers. Some new plastic round and rectangular tables as well as plastic chairs will be donated to replace the old ones.

Paula Zwenger discussed Eucharistic Adoration going forward after Easter. The plan is to start adoration after Corpus Christi with possible Eucharistic procession with Mass on June 22 for Corpus Chrisi and possible potluck after mass – nothing definite yet. Paula is asking for a volunteer to speak at mass once per month regarding their adoration habits. If you would like to volunteer, contact Paula.

Coffee and rolls after mass was discussed as well as the cleaning of the church. New assignment sheets will be available at the back of the church as well as the parish hall. 


