

#### **Temple Worship**

Today's gospel about the cleansing of the temple has a message beyond the unusual behavior of Christ. The gospels tell us that the cleansing of the temple so angered the chief priests and the scribes that they plotted to destroy Christ. When they demanded proof of authority for his behavior, Christ replied, "Destroy this temple

and in three days I will raise it up." He was referring to the temple of his body, to his death and resurrection.

Destroying the temple was one of the charges against Christ at his trial before the Sanhedrin. Witnesses accused Christ of saying will destroy the temple." What he actually said

was, "Destroy this temple." Elsewhere in the gospels Jesus did predict the destruction of the *physical* temple in Jerusalem which occurred in 70 AD.

Pope Benedict XVI wrote that the cleansing of the temple was not simply anger over conducting business in the temple. And it certainly was not an endorsement of violence for righteous causes. The essential message was that the form of worship in the Jerusalem temple was over, and a new era of worship is now in the temple of the Risen Body of Christ through the Eucharist.

The contrast of the worship in these two temples is essential in understanding our faith. At the crucifixion of Jesus the curtain in the temple was torn in two, signifying the end of worship in that temple. The new temple is now the Body of Christ, the church, where his people gather and are united in the sacrament of his Body and Blood.

In the Jerusalem temple animals were sacrificed as sin offerings to God. But the New Testament Letter to the

Hebrew tells us: "It is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. But we have been consecrated through the offering of the Body of Jesus Christ once for all. For by one offering has made he perfect forever those who are being consecrated." Our worship is now in the temple of the Risen Body

Christ which is the church.

Pope Benedict XVI's reflection on today's gospel story of the cleansing of the temple offers this Lenten message on the importance of the Eucharist in our Catholic worship: "The crucifixion of Jesus was the destruction of the form of worship in the Jerusalem temple. Our temple is the body of the Risen One, who gathers and unites his people in the Eucharistic, the sacrament of his Body and Blood."


#### **Meeting after Mass**

While looking for something to fill this page and researching church history, I found information that said Joe T. Pfeifer donated money in 1984 to have the "domes" or "towers" atop the Mother of God and Sacred Heart altars in The Basilica of St. Fidelis "restored to their original size and shape" according to the March 25, 1984, bulletin. Parish Council minutes from February 13, 1984, said a motion was made to replace "the domes over two of the side altars."

I haven't found any other information as to why the domes were removed or needed fixing. Notice that the domes on the undated pictures of the Mother of God and Sacred Heart altars were shaped differently than the ones in the pictures dated 2011. 

# The Canopy Goes Upsy Daisy

Back in November 2023, a cement slab was poured on the north side of the Parish Office with the intention that it would be the home to picnic tables acquired by the parish for use during the Summer Meal Program and other activities.

On Wednesday, February 14, 2024, Fr. Jim Moster noticed out



his office window that a crew from Jason Luecke's Storage Solutions of Hays had arrived to install a canopy / carport over the cement slab (see photo above). They had it installed within a couple of hours. Then on Friday, February 16, the brother duo of Buddy and Curt Kuhn used their manpower to move seven heavy picnic tables to their final resting place on the cement slab.

Buddy acquired 5 round tables from Sonic Drive-In of Wichita which was getting rid of them for free. Buddy delivered them to the Parish Office grounds last summer. Two rectangular picnic tables were donated by Carolyn VonLintel. The carport/canopy was donated by the family of the late Francis and Estella Kuhn, including Francis "Buddy" and Curt Kuhn and their sisters Rose Ann Dreiling and Brenda Dreiling (see photo below).





#### ST. FIDELIS CEMETERY GATE

You may have noticed some changes up at the St. Fidelis Cemetery. Back in July of 2023 Kenny Pfeifer and Wilmer Dinkel (see picture below) worked at removing the old gate which was rusted and falling apart. They said different sized bolts and lots of wire were used to keep the lettering and wrought iron designs in place. In October 2023 Bob Schmidtberger poured cement footings so it would be ready for the new entrance gate. Wilmer supplied limestone posts that needed to be shortened, and Kenny worked at completing the structural uprights of the gate using parts from the original gate.

On January 31, 2024, Jared Scheck with Victoria Lumber Company brought his forklift to help lift the new structural uprights into place (see top photo). Those were powder coated by Leon's Welding of Hays.

The Applied Technology class at Fort Hays State University is cutting out the new lettering that will stretch across the entrance. Since this is a class project, the St. Fidelis parish will only need to pay for the metal used in the lettering.
