

Our Lady of Guadalupe

Tomorrow, December 12, is the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas. There are many reported apparitions of Mary, but Our Lady of Guadalupe is of special significance to the Americas—especially Central America.

The ancient native people of Mexico were suspicious of foreign missionaries as representing outside oppression and the Aztec religion dominated their culture. Then in 1531 a Mexican peasant, Juan Diego, reported a vision of the Virgin Mary at Tepeyac and within a few decades millions of natives were baptized Christians.

Mary told Juan Diego to ask the bishop to build a church on the site of her appearance, but the bishop demanded proof. So Mary sent Juan Diego to Tepeyac on a cold December day to gather roses for the bishop. Imprinted on the mantel in which he carried the roses she left that majestic image of herself. That cloak was made of cactus fibers which should have deteriorated in twenty years but it shows no sign of decay 500 years later. The image still defies all scientific explanations of its origin and rich symbolic meaning has been found in its many details.

The image of Mary on that cloak is central to the native people's devotion to her and their Christian faith. She identified herself as the "Virgin Mary, Mother of the True God, the Creator of all things, Lord of heaven and the earth." Guadalupe teaches us that God uses Mary to lead people to Jesus. Hispanics are uniquely devoted to Our Lady of Guadalupe who led them to her Son.

Mary did not appear to Juan Diego in the image of the European Madonna of the first missionaries, but as a beautiful Aztec princess speaking to



him in his own native language. If we want to help others appreciate the gospel, we must honor the heritage of such people and the culture in which they live. Only then can they come to understand and know Christ. That is true not only of missionaries in foreign lands but also of Christians living in a secular world.

The power of devotion to Mary is revealed in these statistics about the annual pilgrims to major religious shrines: Jerusalem, 2 million; Mecca, 2.5 million; Fatima, 4 million; Assisi, 5 million; Lourdes, 5 million, Padre Pio's tomb, 6 million; and the Basilica of our Lady of Guadalupe, 20 million. David Carrasco of Harvard Divinity School wrote, "It is difficult to overstate the importance of Our Lady of Guadalupe to Central American culture. In Mexico she is everyone's mother."





Verdin is expected to be here sometime this month to install digital control boxes for the strikers in the south sacristy. The new system, which has a remote control, will make it much easier to regulate

The strikers arrived

back in October, but getting them into the tower where they belong was a process that took some thinking.

As a solution, the church's maintenance crew—Kenny Pfeifer and Randy Leiker, along with Curt Kuhn, John Schulte, Eric Pfeifer, Frank Dreiling, Doug Kuhn, John Braun, Bobby Schmidtberger, and Larry Brown—used a CAT line pulley system on Friday, November 25, to carefully lift the heavy equipment to the tower. It took them about three hours to accomplish this task.




