Yoked With Christ

Christianity loves a paradox and today's gospel offers us a memorable image of the apparent contradiction of a paradox: "My yoke is easy and my burden is light." A yoke is a wooden frame placed on the shoulders of oxen to pull a plow. It is not only heavy but also chaffs, rightly a universal symbol of an oppressive burden.

Christ did not deny that his teachings are difficult. The difference is that his yoke is easy and his burden light, which is, of course, an apparent contradiction. A paradox. How can a

of Christian living, as the yoke of oxen, is easier when it is well worn. The more we practice our Catholic faith the more comfortable and rewarding it becomes.

The puzzling attraction of today's gospel is this apparent contradiction that a yoke limits freedom. How can less freedom be easier? Only the very immature understand freedom as a license to do as one pleases. An adult realizes that human freedom must be lived with responsibility. Unlimited freedom is a license to destroy others

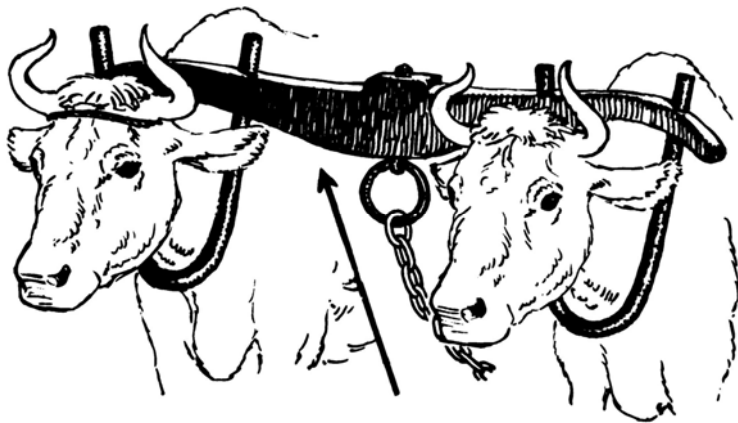
and ultimately oneself. Ironically, unlimited freedom becomes the yoke, the heavy burden of chaos. It was only by a life of responsible freedom that the saints lived the gospel.

Finally, there is a subtle but

essential message in this image of a yoke. A yoke is for a team of oxen; it is made for two. When Christ said, "My yoke is easy." he invited us to share his yoke. Christian life is never a solo act. Christ has assured us in today's gospel that he is our partner in bearing the burdens of Christian life. When we are yoked with Christ we understand this gospel paradox, "My yoke is easy and my burden is light."

yoke be easy and a burden be light? The Christian yoke is easy because the gospel resonates with what is best in us. The Sermon on the Mount, the two great commandments, the parables of the Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son are challenging. Yet we know that such is the way we should live. Even unbelievers find inspiration in the gospels. The Christian yoke fits our human nature well.

And a yoke is easier if it is well worn. Beginning any religious practice can be awkward and stiff, like a new pair of shoes. But fidelity to such practices brings both consolation and comfort. St. Francis said of his conversion, "What before seemed bitter was changed into sweetness." A well-worn yoke is more comfortable and makes the work easier. The yoke

New Saint Ann Cemetery Guidelines

The Saint Ann Pastoral Council members met with Father James Moster on May 17, 2023, to discuss the need for a policy regarding flowers and other items placed on or near headstones in the cemetery at Walker. The Council has approved the following policy for Saint Ann Cemetery. **This policy will go into effect on July 1, 2023.**

- Items placed on monuments or bases are acceptable and will not be removed.
- All items placed in or on the ground around monuments will be removed before each mowing. This will include mementos, flowers, and solar lights.
- No glass containers will be allowed.
- Plants and flowers growing in the ground will be mowed.
- No spraying of herbicides or chemicals is allowed.

Items removed will be placed in barrels near the walk-in gates on the east side of the cemetery

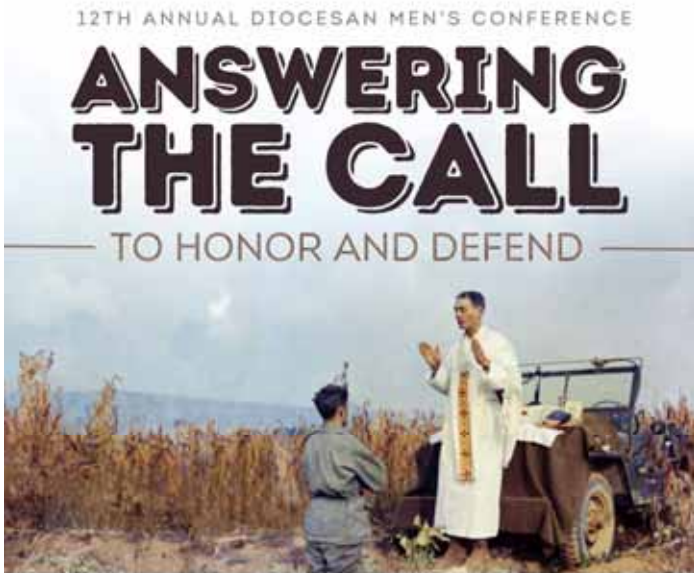
David asked me a question today. He asked with which hand I received the Eucharist. This started me thinking of the many misconceptions that people often have about the Catholic Church; the biggest being that we have so many “rules” in our doctrine.

Our faith is not based on “what we cannot do” but on expanding our love for God and our neighbor. Recent Popes have been highlighting the importance of showing that the Catholic life is not one of toil and drudgery but of joy and fulfillment.

Because mistakes, missteps, and sin are part of the human condition, rules were established by religions to help give guidance. The Catholic Church, because of this, is often seen as a “rules obedience” organization. Today’s church does not throw this out, it has become more of a personal growth through faith organization.

The Scriptures are interpreted with an eye on humility, generosity, tolerance, justice, and love. Instead of highlighting what will “get you into Hell,” today’s priests stress those actions that will expand the characteristics mentioned above—much the same way Jesus preached during his lifetime. 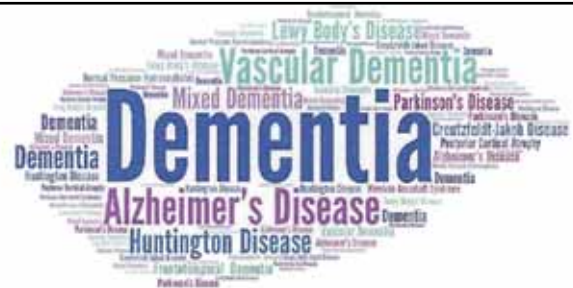

Victoria's Greenway Walking Trail

Did you know that Victoria has a walking trail in town and off the beaten path? With permission from the City of Victoria, USD 432, and St. John's Place, a 2.20-mile trail was created to give the community a place to walk, run, or hike.

This path is mowed shorter than the grass around it and marked with white arrows and dashes to try to make it as easy as possible to follow. The "Trailhead" starts and ends at the tennis courts east of Victoria Elementary.
