The Other Good Samaritan

There are two parables in the gospel about Samaritans who were good persons. The Good Samaritan parable is better known but the Samaritan leper in today's gospel was also a man of virtue. He returned to give thanks, in contrast to the other nine lepers. We read this gospel on Thanksgiving Day as a challenge to imitate his gratitude.



In a village near Jerusalem, Jesus saw ten lepers. He cured them, but only one remembered to thank Him.

The gospel stories of the Good and the Grateful Samaritan have a one-two punch. The second punch is the haymaker. The Good Samaritan was heroically kind to a stranger and the Samaritan leper was humbly grateful. But there is much more.

The knockout punch in these stories is that they were Samaritans. Jews and Samaritans did not associate with each other. Yet the nine outcast Jewish lepers in today's parable had welcomed a Samaritan leper into their group. And he accepted them. Leprosy made them physically ill, but it cured them of their prejudice. There are no atheists in fox holes and no bigots in cancer wards. In today's gospel there was no prejudice in a colony of

Samaritan and Jewish lepers.

The very idea of a Samaritan being a good person troubled the audience of Christ. We all have Samaritans in our lives, people whom we deem inferior to ourselves. At times we prejudge even our own family, our friends, and our neighbors: a careless child, a stubborn spouse, a nosy neighbor. And we take perverse comfort in their perceived failings as though that somehow made us more virtuous.

Realizing that the Samaritans in my life are as good as I am, perhaps better in some ways, is a difficult moment of truth. When that defense is stripped away, I must face my conscience with a new candor. The goodness of the Samaritans in my life challenges me to a more authentic self.

The Good Samaritan and the Grateful Samaritan do remind us to be kind to our neighbor and thankful for our blessings. But they also reveal that those whom we judge to be less virtuous are often, in some matters, more virtuous than we are. The Samaritans in our lives make us face our failings honestly.

In the Bible, leprosy is often an image of sin and being cured of leprosy is analogous to being cleansed of sin. When their shared illness reduced them to their common humanity, all ten lepers were freed of their sin of prejudice. If we confront our prejudices we will also welcome modern day Samaritans into our lives and our community. Sinners can't be choosy.
