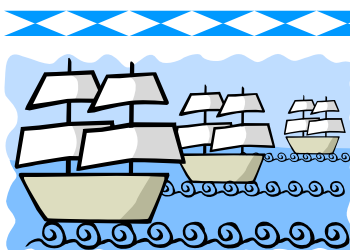

## A Letter from St. Francis (Chapter II)

Those who are not doing penance, and do not receive the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and who do not observe what they have promised the Lord are devoted to the world and to the anxieties of their possessions and to the cares of this life. The devil deceives them (Jn 8:41) and they do not see the true light of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

They do not have spiritual wisdom, since they do not have the Son of God who is the True Wisdom of the Father, concerning whom it is said: "It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to put confidence in princes." (Ps. 118:9) They see and do not understand, they work wrong things and knowingly forfeit God's blessings.

The spiritually blind are deceived by the flesh, the world, and the devil. For them it is sweet to the body to

work for themselves and bitter to serve God. All vices and sins come forth and proceed from the heart of man, just as the Lord says in the Gospel. (Mk 7:21) And they think they will possess the vanities of this age for a long time, but they are deceived, since there will come the day and the hour, which we do not know, when the body weakens and death approaches.

And when anyone dies in culpable sin without penance and satisfaction, who could have made satisfaction but did not, the soul leaves the body not in peace but with anguish and tribulation. And all talents and power and knowledge and wisdom (2 Chron 1:12), which they thought they had, the evil one bears it away from them. (Lk 8:18; Mk 4:25). And their forsaken neighbors and friends say, "He could have given more to those in need and he acquired what he did not rightly earn." And so they will perish body and soul in this short age and they will not go to life eternal.

Those to whom this letter was meant to be addressed, we beg in the Love which God is (1 Jn 4:16), that they receive kindly the comforting words of Our Lord Jesus Christ with divine love. And let them read his words often; and let them keep the counsel of the Lord with holy work even to the end, since these are spirit and life. (Jn 6:64) And they who would do this, will be favored on the day of judgement (Mt 12:36) before the tribunal of Our Lord Jesus Christ. (Rm 14:10)

To the extent permitted by the constitution of the United States, the people, through their elected state representatives and state senators, may pass laws regarding abortion, including, but not limited to, in circumstances of pregnancy resulting from rape or incest, or when necessary to save the life of the mother.”*

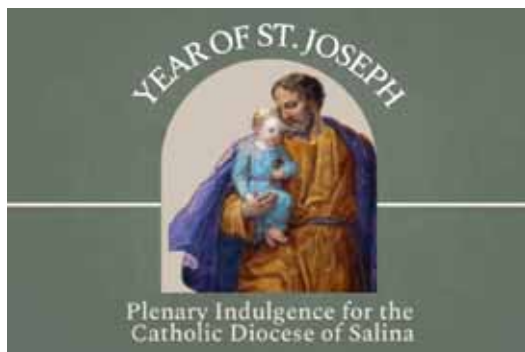
