ASH WEDNESDAY—MARCH 2

Lent is a time of grace and renewal for the entire Church, especially for the catechumens and candidates preparing for initiation during the Easter Triduum. The three traditional ascetical practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are important pillars for a faithful experience of Lent.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics (for those age 18 until age 59). In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from eating meat (for those age 14 and over). When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

The Beam in Your Eye

Today's gospel offers this timely reflection to prepare for Ash Wednesday and Lent: "Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye but not perceive the wooden beam in your own?"



The eye has one significant limitation. It cannot see itself. When we get a speck of dust in our eye we cannot see it. We need the help of a mirror or another person. As we cannot see that speck, we are blind to our own glaring faults, yet we see the petty faults of another, often magnified.

The gospel analogy offers three points for Lenten reflection: Our own faults are often greater than those of others; our personal failings distort our vision of others; and we need help in seeing our own faults.

"Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye but not perceive the wooden beam in your own." Too often we demand more of others than ourselves. Our greater fault, the beam, we overlook in ourselves; the lesser failing, the speck, is unacceptable in others.

Our own fault, that beam in our eye, also distorts our vision of others. A streak on your eyeglasses is imposed enlarged onto all that you see. Our own faults we project onto others, often magnified. Those who harbor grudges, find others unforgiving. Those who gossip resent others who carry tales. The miser complains that another is not generous.

As our eye cannot see itself, we are often blind to our faults and need help to see the flaws in our character. There are mirrors to help us find that beam in our eye: the scripture readings, a kind confessor, or a trusted friend. We are grateful to the one who removes a particle from our eye. Yet when others kindly point out our mistakes we take offense, although they are relieving us of a source of pain.

When it is our duty as a parent, teacher, or spouse to admonish another, we need to recall the delicate care required to remove a speck from another's eye. It must be done gently, with surgical care, lest we do serious damage. So it is in correcting the failings of others.

The ashes this Wednesday can remind us of the interior ashes that soil our character. Lent is a time to find those faults that we cannot see but can be revealed with prayer, the gospel readings, and the candor of others. "Remove the wooden beam in your own eye first, that you may see clearly to remove the splinter from your brother's eye."

If you would like to participate in this event, **please do so by Saturday, March 5**.

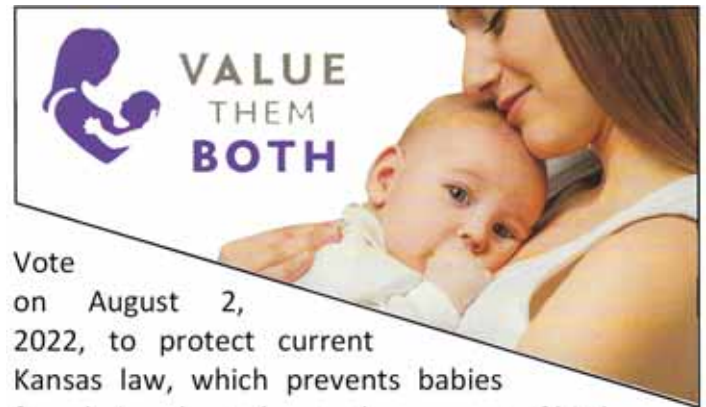

The Worldwide Synod — March Meeting at St. Nick's in Hays

The first phase of the two-year synod called by Pope Francis is happening in local dioceses throughout the world. The goal of the synod is to become a more "listening" Church. A listening session will be held in **Hays at St. Nicholas Parish Pall on Sunday, March 20, at 3:00 p.m.** Anyone is invited to participate.

The entire Catholic Church is called to participate in the upcoming Synod of Bishops. This synod is entitled: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission." Pope Francis has called the entire People of God to journey together. This synod is not just another meeting with oral presentations and written reports. This synod is a process of journeying together by listening, dialoguing, praying, discerning, and making decisions together for the purpose of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Pope Francis is asking each local diocese to gather—clergy, religious, and laity together—to listen to each other. The goal of this journeying together is not to create a new vision or pastoral plan with objectives. Rather, the goal of our journeying together is to be present with one another, to listen and learn with each other, and to grow closer to the Lord and His Church.

"This synod offers us the opportunity to be with each other, to invite our family and friends back to the faith, to listen to each other's joys and sorrows, and share our hope and dreams for our parishes." ~Cardinal Wilton Gregory

Synod is a Greek word; *synodos* means a meeting or assembly. The two Greek words that make up synod are *syn*, meaning together, and *hodos*, meaning way or journey.

Vatican II pointed out that the Church is not the Kingdom but it is the People of God accompanying one another on the pilgrimage to the Kingdom. Synodality is a periodic assessment, not of the progress toward the Kingdom, but of our accompanying one another.

Synod listening sessions will be held in seven locations within the diocese: Manhattan, Salina, Hays, Colby, Norton, Tipton, and Belleville.

The questions for discussion will be the following.

1. What brings you joy in your local parish or in the larger Church right now?
2. What brings you sadness about the Church?
3. Where do you see the Spirit leading the Church?
