“Amen, Amen,  
I say to you,

falls to the ground  
and dies,

John 12:20-33





## A Grain of Wheat

Many of the parables of Christ are related to agriculture, which should offer clear messages to farming communities. In today's gospel Christ uses the image of a grain of wheat to teach a fundamental truth of our faith, "Unless the grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies it remains just a grain of wheat. But if it dies it produces much fruit."

He used that natural process to explain the spiritual message of his coming death and resurrection. It is a significant illustration because the Paschal Mystery of the death and resurrection of Christ is the very core of the Christian faith. The season of Lent is founded on this mystery as these forty days will culminate in the events of Holy Week, the historical roots of our faith.

While this image of the grain of wheat in today's gospel illustrates the death and resurrection of Christ, it has application also in our own lives. The most fundamental of these is the death and rising to life eternal of each faithful Christian. We pray each Sunday in the Nicene creed, "I believe in the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come."

The grain of wheat is also an illustration of our baptism. St. Paul wrote, "We were buried with him through baptism into his death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too

might live in newness of life." (Rm 6:4-5) This is expressed in our Lenten practices of continual conversion. The bad habits, perhaps sinful habits, of our lives are likewise to die and then produce the fruit of virtue. Selfishness is to be changed into charity, greed is to be overcome by generosity, self-indulgence is to die and rise by caring for others.

There may be difficulties in the process of such a grain of wheat dying and rising. But as the old farmers said, "If you don't shovel snow in the winter, you won't shovel wheat in the summer." The motto of our state of Kansas reminds us, "Ad astra per aspera."

So if the rigors of Lent get weary, recall that our faith offers the hope of renewed spirit through the struggles of a faithful life. As St. Paul wrote, "If we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him." (Rm 6:8) "Unless the grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies it remains just a grain of wheat. But if it dies it produces much fruit."

### SANCTUARY ANGELS RETURN

After having been in flight and in a holding pattern for almost a year, the angels will be alighting once again on each side of the altar. This is anticipated before Easter and as soon as the scaffolding is taken away. We thank Kevin McCarter of Victoria for his work in restoring and Dustin Poche and Shannon Trevathan of Russell for repainting them. Painting of the church is now completed.

The north and south rose windows, together with the ones facing east over the side altars have been replaced. We are waiting for other certain stained glass windows to be re-installed before the scaffolding can be removed, hopefully after Palm Sunday.

Meanwhile, the altars are being cleaned and touched up, the Stations of the Cross have been cleaned and gold touched highlights repainted and other projects of cleaning and repairs are in progress.

## Quick Church Clean-up

The scaffolding in the church should come down after Palm Sunday.

When that happens, the pews and floor will need cleaning. Because that will be Holy Week, we will simply dust and vacuum so the pews are clean for Holy Week services.

# SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASS OBLIGATION

The dispensation given for all Catholics from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect until it is safe to lift it. The dispensation from Sunday Mass obligation continues because the Church does not want to place a moral burden on those who should not attend Sunday Mass because of age or health conditions.

However, Catholics are still obliged to keep the Commandments, including the Commandment to keep holy the Lord's Day. Families who choose not to attend Mass should conduct a Liturgy of the Word in the home. Individuals and families should spend additional time in prayer, pious devotions, and spiritual reading on Sunday. Younger adults who are least at risk from the virus should take advantage of the opportunity to participate in person at Mass and to receive Holy Communion if they are properly disposed. If those in good health are attending other large social gatherings, they should also be participating at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sundays.

*For those attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, we expect to continue social distancing and the wearing of masks in church.*

**Divine Mercy Sunday**

The Divine Mercy Prayer Service will be held at **3:00 p.m. Sunday, April 11**, at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church. The hour will include Eucharistic Exposition, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy in song, litany of prayers, and meditation.

Jesus entrusted Saint Maria Faustina with the task of spreading the message of his Divine Mercy through a series of visions and interior locutions in the 1930s. When Pope John Paul II canonized Saint Faustina on April 30, 2000, he declared the Sunday after Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday and an official feast day of the Church.

Everyone is encouraged to pray the novena to the Divine Mercy, which begins on Good Friday. Leaflets on this novena are at the church entrances at St. Fidelis, St. Ann, and St. Boniface.

Confessions will be heard beginning at 2:00 p.m. at IHM Church. This prayer service is sponsored by Divine Mercy Radio.
