Capuchin Franciscan Padre Pio was born on May 25, 1887, in Pietrelcina, in southern Italy, as Francesco Forgione. He was named in honor of St. Francis of Assisi and was one of eight children of Grazio and Maria Forgione. Francesco was very devout even as a child, and at an early age felt drawn to the priesthood. In his own words, my "childhood was as unremarkable as 'unsalted macaroni.'"

He entered the Capuchins at age 15 or 16, of feeble health, but strong will. He received the Capuchin habit as a novice in 1902. He was ordained a priest in 1910 after 7 years of study. Pio was transferred to San Giovanni Rotondo, Italy, 1916, and spent 50 years there.

On Sept 20, 1918, the five (constantly) bleeding wounds of Christ (stigmata) appeared on Padre Pio's hands, feet, and side. Padre Pio was kneeling in front of a large crucifix when received visible marks of the Crucifixion. He was the first priest with the stigmata in the history of the Church—Francis of Assisi had a form of stigmata, but he was a deacon. When asked if the wounds hurt, Padre Pio responded, "Do you think the Lord gave them to me for decoration?" The blood from the stigmata had an odor described by many as similar to perfume or flowers. The doctors who examined Padre Pio could not find any natural cause for the wounds.

He loved the sick and penitents and respected the role of doctors and founded "The House for the Relief of Suffering." He spent long hours of prayer, with continual austerity, and a love for Eucharist and Blessed Virgin Mary. He described himself: "I am a poor friar who prays." He experienced visions, ecstasies, trances, and demonic assaults. He provided Confession and spiritual guidance to many. He read hearts and knew the penitent's sins before Confession. He was "harsh" with the insincere and unrepentant. Otherwise, he was of pleasant humor. He recommended daily Mass with Communion, half-hour meditations in the morning and evening, and the study of the Bible. His favorite prayer was the rosary--his "weapon" against the wiles of the devil.

Padre Pio prayed that the stigmata would become invisible (as was the case with Saint Catherine of Siena). But they did not disappear until the week before his death. During that week, the wounds gradually disappeared. Upon his death, the skin was left unscarred and intact. Padre Pio had predicted 50 years prior that upon his death the wounds would heal. He said, "I will make more noise when I am dead than when I was alive." He died on September 23, 1968 at the age of eighty-one. His funeral was attended by about 100,000 people. He was beatified in 1999 and canonized in June 16, 2002, because of his CHARITY, not because of the stigmata.

Padre Pio often said, "Pray, hope, and don't worry."



The exterior of our beloved church is in need of repair. This restoration project will help preserve the structure and beauty of our church for generations to come.



Mid-Continental Restoration Co., Inc. will be completing this work. The scope of the project includes:

Sealant Application to Vertical Joints in Stone Caps & Bands

All vertical head joints between coping stones and stone bands will be cut back and cleaned of any loose or foreign debris. These joints will then be resealed with new sealant, tooled to a neat and uniform appearance, and colormatched as closely as possible to the existing material.

Tuckpointing Stone Mortar Joints

All mortar joints will be carefully inspected. Any that are found to be void, open, or defective will be repaired. All affected areas will be cleaned to remove any loose residue, and defective joints will be repointed using a non-staining, non-shrinking Type "N" masonry mortar. This mortar will be color-matched and tooled to blend seamlessly with the surrounding joints.

The total estimated cost for this vital work is **\$109,980.** We are asking for your generosity in helping us raise the necessary funds to complete these repairs.
