Vote Your Conscience

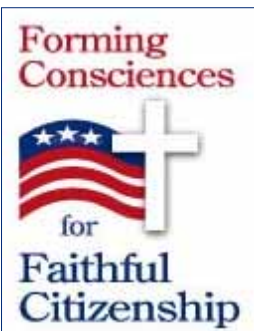
Today's gospel has a not too subtle message on how you should vote. "Repay to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's." That famous verse is often abused. It does present the church and state as separate, but not as unrelated. Repayment states an obligation. We owe something to Caesar and everything to God. The authority of the state over the citizens is related to and derived from the supreme authority of God.

"Repay to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's." The conjunction is "and" not "but". "And" denotes unity, continuity, not separation. Civil authority is derived ultimately from God, and our social responsibilities are related to our faith in God. Your conscience cannot be separated from your politics.

A faith commitment does not lessen a civic commitment. It enriches it. The principles of justice and truth, compassion and mercy, which our faith instills in us animate noble political convictions. An authentic democracy will hear not only what Thomas Jefferson, Benjamin Franklin, and Abraham Lincoln can teach us, but also what Jesus of Nazareth, Francis of Assisi, and Mother Theresa can contribute to the public debate.

This is not to say that your church should tell you how to vote. The Catholic bishops have stated, "We do not intend to form a voting bloc." They

have however issued a guide entitled, "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship." It is available in printed form or online at www.usccb.org.



This important document will help you to vote your conscience, your informed conscience. Not a vested interest, not a family tradition, not a casual preference, but a conviction of conscience based on gospel values. The church does not forfeit your right to conscience. The church helps you to form a right conscience. Because your conscience cannot be separated from your politics.



The church will not endorse specific candidates. You are the judge, in the sanctuary of your conscience, as to which candidate will more effectively defend human life and promote human dignity. You are to consider a candidate's value of human life, the candidate's integrity, and his or her ability to realize the campaign promises they have made. No one can make that judgment for you.

Vote your conscience. But first take the time to inform your conscience on the issues at hand and the gospel principles of our faith related to those questions. And then be sure to vote! "Repay to Caesar what is Caesar's, and repay to God what is God's" Your conscience cannot be separated from your politics.

DIOCESAN ANNIVERSARY MASS CELEBRATED LOCALLY

Plans for the Anniversary Masses scheduled for October 18 in Hays and October 25 in Salina have been altered due to the pandemic. We will still recognize couples celebrating their 1st anniversary and all anniversaries ending in 0 or 5 this calendar year with each couple being recognized in their home parish at a regularly scheduled Mass the weekend of October 24-25.
